WE'RE GLAD YOU'RE WITH US. In this difficult and uncertain time, our commitment to one another as the Body of Christ is more important than ever. We are blessed to be able to join together in prayer, even as we are unable to be together in person as we would wish. Our online services are all available from the [Online Worship](#) page of our website.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of CHRIST THE KING, focusing on the all-embracing authority of Christ as King and Lord of all things. This feast day falls on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Sunday before the beginning of Advent. Christ the King is a relatively new feast day; it was instituted in the Roman Catholic Church by Pope Pius XI in 1925. It is not an official observance of the Episcopal Church, but many of our churches choose to observe it as a way to remind ourselves of Christ's reign over all creation. Paradoxically, however, that reign is evidenced not by great power and glory, but by Christ's sacrifice and death on a cross; his crown is made not of gold, but of thorns. We look forward to Christ's second coming in power and the fulfillment of the promise of his kingship: "Mercifully grant that the peoples of the earth, divided and enslaved by sin, may be freed and brought together under Christ's most gracious rule." But until such fulfillment, our understanding of Christ as King of kings is tempered by our understanding of him as the Crucified One.
