Today is TRINITY SUNDAY, the feast of the church year that celebrates the unity of the Triune God, as expressed in the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds. It is one of seven principal feasts of the Church year, and the only one dedicated to a theological concept. Our faith in the Trinity means that we understand the eternal essence of God to be community – relationship. The early church used the Greek word perichoresis – a mutual dancing or flowing around one another. Just as a relationship

of mutual sharing and love is intrinsic to who God is, so we are also intrinsically relational beings – we find our fullest selves in community and relationship with God and with each other. The Trinity can be understood as a Divine Dance of complete mutuality, one into which we too are called.



No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.
