
## **+ PANCAKE BRUNCH - SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 19<sup>TH</sup>**

## + THE RECTOR'S CORNER

This coming Sunday, February 5th, we will welcome back our two seminarians from their winter break! I am looking forward to their presence as they have added a great deal to the life of our community. Since September, Susanna & Seth have been an integral part to the liturgy, teaching, and planning of St. George's church. I could not ask for two better seminarians as they have participated in their field education here at St. George's.

One of the most beneficial relationships that has evolved over the past several months is the partnership we at St. George's have created with Comfort the Children International. The Seminary of the Southwest and its field education coordinating faculty, Dr. Kathleen Russell, has developed a new program for select students to receive joint training with a church and a local non-profit organization. Because of the friendship The Rev. Zane Wilemon, executive director of CTC International, and I have, Dr. Russell approached us to begin this program. Over the course of last semester Susannah, Seth, Zane, and I have been meeting on a regular basis. During these meetings we have discussed what it means to be a priest both in a parish and in the world of non-profit. Our conversations have been extremely beneficial for all involved.

During the Middler year (second of three years in seminary) the seminarians' duties and responsibilities in the parish have been to be in regular attendance at Sunday services, preach and teach once a semester, and simply get to know the congregation. Because of the unique relationship with CTC, they have additional responsibilities to attend at least two CTC events and become familiar with their office and staff. Both Susannah and Seth have accomplished these responsibilities over last semester and will continue to do so this semester.

For those of you who are not familiar with CTC International I encourage you to visit their website and learn more ([www.ctcinternational.org/](http://www.ctcinternational.org/)). CTC is a rising global non-profit organization that is located both here in Austin and in Kenya. Their work in Kenya consists of over thirty staff that run multiple outreach facilities; including a clinic, a school for disabled children, a sewing shop for the mother's of the disabled children, community gardens, and much more. Along with these facilities CTC organizes and facilitates mission trips for both religious and non-religious groups. Recently Susanna & Seth have received a Scm grant to travel to Kenya this summer. This is a great opportunity for the two of them to have hands on experience with the CTC work in Kenya. While there, they will also be involved with a seminary in Kenya.

Wonderful things are happening for St. George's and CTC because of this relationship and I look forward to the fruits of our work together. Next time you see Susannah & Seth I encourage you to ask more about their experience here at St. George's and CTC. Have a great month and I hope to see you soon! God bless!

Green Action in Kleberg Hall: Blue recycling buckets are set up and functioning in Kleberg Hall. The large blue can is for single-stream recycling (paper, cans, glass and plastics with numbers 1 - 7.) And now, we can recycle plastic utensils and plastic plates, if they are rinsed first. All utensils can be put in the gray restaurant tub on the counter, to soak in water. Other trash goes into the brown landfill barrel.

On the counter is a small blue bucket where you can recycle cd's and batteries, glasses and cell phones. Recycled eye glasses will be donated to the Lions Club for re-use. And cell phones will be reprogrammed for people at Safe Place.

## + *Hildegard's Illumination: An Epiphany Season of Healing*

Hildegard of Bingen was known as a healer and we have frequently focused on healing on or near her Feast Day in September. But this year during the Sundays after Epiphany, we are experiencing a Season of Healing in a way that is stretching us in new ways. Like many of our liturgical seasons in the past, this one was inspired by a book that was used in the Servant Leadership School. Last Fall we had a class about healing mandalas; another book about the healing chakras was a secondary resource. It was written by Brenda Davies, an M.D. who was born with a gift of healing that was evident when she was a small child. After her medical training she hid the spiritual gift of healing because it wasn't accepted. For many years she had two lives – one was working as a psychiatrist and the other was offering retreats and teaching about spiritual healing. Finally she was able to integrate these two forms of healing and be open about it even when she faced ridicule.

In other sacred traditions especially in China and India, healing and well-being has been connected to the balance and free-flow of energy in the body. It is common now in our culture to work with chakras, energy centers in our bodies, and many work with energetic healing practices like tai chi or healing touch. At St. Hildegard's we have found Qi-gong movements a helpful way to engage our bodies at some of our retreats. Yet I noticed there was still separation. It had never occurred to me to mention anything like this in a sermon. But I wondered why not? I became curious about looking for connections with Jesus and stories in the gospels and the chakras. St. Hildegard's Vision states that we are open to the wisdom of other sacred traditions. In the past we have found wisdom from Buddhist and Sufi sources; perhaps we could learn something here as well. So our goal this season is to be firmly rooted in the Christian tradition, opening to this wisdom that has come from Hindu and other sources from the East. It is at a very elementary level and yet fascinating. There are new depths in the Gospel stories that I hadn't seen before. Each Sunday the sermon includes a brief healing meditation.

Jesus was known and sought after as a healer. We don't know very much about his understanding of the energetics that were involved. We recall the time when a woman in a crowd touched him and was healed and that Jesus felt energy leave. Although other healing stories don't mention it, this confirms a perception of energy that was probably routinely present. In Hildegard's view the whole universe is full of sacred power and every creature, indeed all of creation radiates this energy. She believes that God has adapted all the power of the elements to flow through human beings: "God has firmly adapted the powers of the world to us so that we breathe, inhale, and exhale these powers like the sun, which illuminates the earth, sends forth its rays, and draws them back again to itself." I have come to realize that when Jesus told his disciples to be a light to the world, he may have been speaking energetically. With the light of Christ shining in and through us there is healing energy transforming our own lives and shining healing love into the world. I 'get it' in a new way! This year as we share our lives, may we all be touched with Christ's healing light.

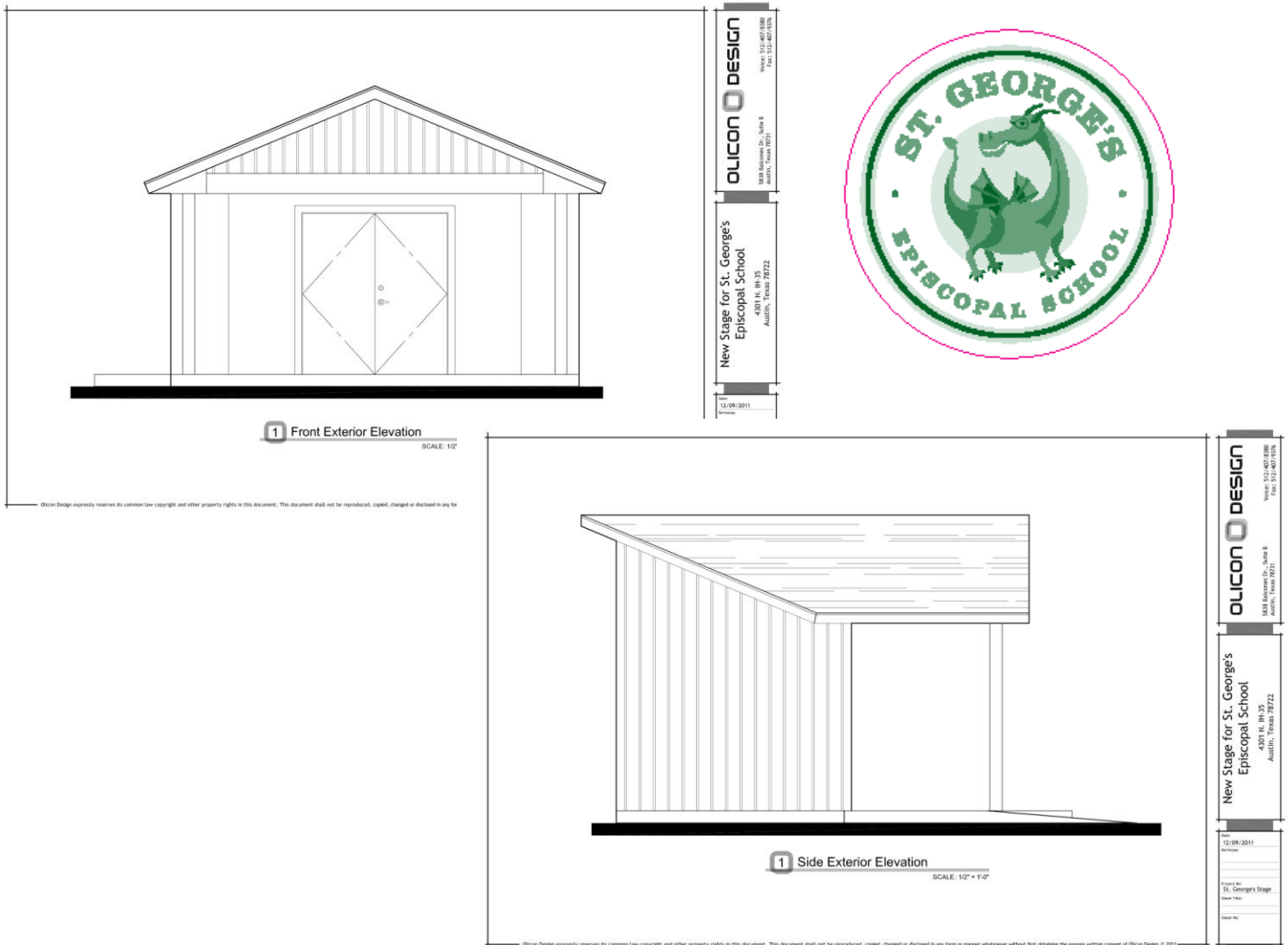
