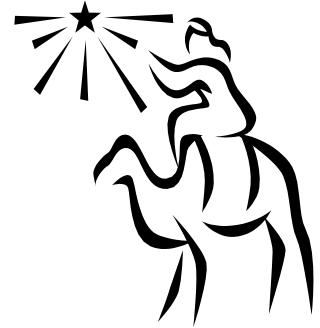

**THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY**

FRIDAY, JANUARY 6<sup>TH</sup> AT 7:00 P.M.

Please join us this evening at **7:00 p.m.** for the celebration of **The Feast of the Epiphany, with Holy Eucharist.** The word "Epiphany" comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, which means, "appearing" or "revealing." The themes of the Epiphany season focus on God's self-revelation in Christ. Christian traditions continue to pay special attention to the visit of the Magi and on the baptism of Jesus, especially the voice from heaven that identifies Jesus as God's Son. During the Epiphany season, the predominant theme is upon God making God known to the world through Jesus, the divine Son. Please join us as St. George's family continues this Christian tradition.

## + *Hildegard's Illumination: A New Tradition*

The beautiful banner of the Virgin of Guadalupe was a regal presence on the east wall of Kleberg as about forty people processed into the circle, singing *Los Mañanitas*, carrying fresh red roses to place near her feet. Cindy had created the barren Tepeyac hill beneath her from different shades of fabric and pots of cacti; the offered roses represented the flowers that miraculously bloomed in the wilderness when the Virgin appeared to Juan Diego in 1531. Later during Prayers of the People Kleberg was darkened and candles were lit in silence and placed near the banner. As each candle was lit the Virgin became more radiant. It was the Third Sunday of Advent, December 11<sup>th</sup> and St. Hildegard's was presenting our first Virgin of Guadalupe liturgy and celebration. It was so lovely and well received that we've already decided it needs to be an annual Advent tradition.

Earlier in November we had chosen Guadalupe's Feast to experiment with offering a public liturgy, one that we publicized, where we focused on welcoming visitors. Gretchen and I designed bookmarks and had them printed to pass out at the 'Chant for Peace' and 'Women and Fair Trade' events held the weekend of November 11-13<sup>th</sup>. We were inspired by The Rev. Virginia Marie Rincon's experience with celebrating the Virgin's feast day in Maine where she had worked in Hispanic Ministry for the diocese and had founded a non-profit for Latina women and their families. She generously let us use her banner and shared copies of the traditional music as well as the Rite II service she had planned. Susan investigated local celebrations and helped with the Space. Mary worked diligently to get English translations of the Spanish songs so that we'd understand the meaning while singing in Spanish. She also prepared the service leaflets that included all the songs. Daphne helped find readings and I created a Rite 3 liturgy based on a Lessons and Carols format. In addition to the Gospel for the Day we included readings about Juan Diego's vision and the significance of the feast day. A reading from Elizabeth Johnson's *Quest for the Living God* explored the theology. Virginia Marie told the story of the artist: The banner had been painted by an immigrant, who signed it "Denny," the American name he chose for himself. He had been referred to her for pastoral care as he was depressed and wounded after a traumatic journey to Maine. In meeting with him she had discovered his artistic talent in numerous small paintings he had done. He had never done a large painting but with her encouragement, and after she showed up with all the art supplies, he agreed. In spite of his trepidation gradually the beautiful *Virgen* emerged. As Denny painted, he gained confidence and also began to heal. His story is representative of the Virgin of Guadalupe's healing presence from the Sixteenth Century onward.

We sung our beautiful Advent Mass – "Into the hush of uncertainty comes a whisper" and concluded with a moving drumming ceremony by Virginia Marie. As we shared homemade tamales and cinnamon cookies, we enjoyed meeting the visitors. A few came because of our bookmarks; more came because someone had invited them personally. Most of us sampled both delicious, traditional hot drinks made by Cindy – vanilla *atóle* and Mexican hot chocolate. We hope some of you will be able to join us next year!

## + NEWS FROM ST. GEORGE'S EPISCOPAL DAY SCHOOL



Happy New Year! We are so excited to be back at school again after a wonderful, restful break. The teachers and I couldn't wait to see the sweet faces of our students again!

Advent was a special time at St. George's Episcopal School. The entire school gathered twice a week in the library to have advent chapel together. We started by decorating a Christmas tree with handmade ornaments. On the first day of chapel, a very large wrapped box was sitting on the table. The children guessed what might be in the box, and we open it to reveal a large advent wreath! We talked about how advent means "the coming" and that we are spending this time together and lighting one candle at a time to wait for "the coming" of a very special baby named Jesus. We sang the song "Light One Candle" as we lit the advent wreath each time. The chapel services that followed focused on a gift of the season including love, family, light, grace, hope, peace, patience, strength and joy. We unwrapped a gift each morning that symbolized one of these spiritual gifts. You should have seen the excited faces when they guessed what might be in the box and when the gift was revealed! It was such a special time to be together during this season that is filled with messages of hope and love.

Our fall semester chapel services culminated in two outreach projects that benefit organizations close to St. George's heart. Before Thanksgiving break, we collected non-perishable food items for St. George's Court and before Christmas break, we collected unwrapped toys for Foundation Communities. We blessed these items at the altar and talked about why we give to others, especially during this time of year. This year, the amount of food and toys that were donated was overwhelming! The school families responded in a huge way to this opportunity to give back to the community.

Speaking of blessings, another big thank you so much to all of the parishioners who have donated to the school Annual Fund. A formal thank you note is going in the mail next week, but we want you to know how much we appreciate your constant and generous support over the years! We surpassed our goal of \$10,000 with a total of \$12,968! Almost \$13,000! Amazing! We will have that outdoor theater on the playground in no time, as well as funds available for curriculum and improvements to our wonderful school!

And finally, thank you so much for your patience and good humor as we all learn how to use the new gate locks that were installed over Christmas break. All gates are permanently locked except for the east and west gates (by the playground and by my office) with signs directing visitors to the church and school offices. The locks were too expensive (\$1,000 a piece - thank you Annual Fund!) to add a third to the Crestwood gate, and since that gate was closer to the street, we decided to go with the safer gate farther from the street by the playground. I had our first visit and tour of 2012 yesterday, and the mom commented that it "felt like Fort Knox" - in a good way! Since what we are protecting is far more valuable than gold, I am taking that as a huge compliment. If you are having trouble with the gates during the week, please stop by my office and I will gladly help you out!
