Interim Priest's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

The 172nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas closed out the month of February. I was very impressed with how smoothly it all ran, given that it was entirely held via Zoom and included electronic voting by all delegates. It appeared smooth to the participants, but I'm sure that in reality it was like the duck that smoothly glides across the water while its two little legs are paddling like crazy below the surface! Special thanks to our four delegates who attended Council on

behalf of St. George's – Patsy Chandler, Brad Dieringer, Spencer Gordon, and Frances Rickard. An additional thank you to Frances for her participation in the zoom choir made up of people from all over the diocese, that was very impressive! At our March 3rd Lenten program (see the article on page 4 for more details), we will hear from our four delegates about their thoughts and experiences. In our Diocesan Bishop Doyle's address at Council, he recognized the suffering that we all have gone through over the past year. In the naming of the suffering, he continued, is his prayer for gifts and talents to meet the work. He said that the miracle is not the work that has and will continue to be done; rather, the miracle is us.

As part of the work that we, the people of St. George's, are currently being called to do, I invite you all to complete the **Congregational Assessment Tool** (for more information, see the article on page 3). The survey will only be available for three and a half weeks. Why not make a Lenten commitment to complete it within a week? This is Step Five of the Nineteen Steps towards calling a new Rector (see the article on page 5 for a complete list of the Nineteen Steps).

Another aspect of our process involves working through the Five Focus Points – Heritage, Leadership, Connections, Mission, and Future. These five points are the focus of this year's Lenten Series (see the article on page 4 for more details). Each of these five points builds upon one another. Heritage was our base, and at the beginning of March, we turn to Leadership. Just as the church is not merely a building but rather the people, so church leadership is not limited to the clergy but is also – and perhaps primarily – the people. This is a time to look at the leadership of our church and ask who has unrecognized talents, who would like to try their hand at something new, and who is ready to take on new ministries! Remember that God chooses us and provides the tools for us. I talked about tools in my sermon on February 28th; we have a toolbox that we may not even be aware of in our hands. In Mexico, my traveling communion kit was actually in a fishing tackle box, and it still is! I always love that name – "tackle box." We can tackle whatever we need because it is in that box and we have God's help with the assignment!

After nearly a year without being able to regularly celebrate the Eucharist together, I am thrilled to invite all of you to attend a service of Eucharist and receive Holy Communion again. Beginning on Sunday, March 7th, we will be holding a weekly, outdoor, in-person service Eucharist service on Sundays at 12:15 pm at the back of the school playground. See the article on page 4 for more details about how to register and how the service will work.

We have all come a long way since Bishop Doyle's letter on March 13, 2020, which changed the way we have been worshiping (and doing everything else) for the past year. Look at all that we have all learned about community, technical production, and our love for one another!

Planning Our Future Together: We Want to Know Your Story!



Our church has entered into a time of discernment during which we are gathering information to guide our decisions for our future. Recent bulletins have included announcements about one aspect of this process: the **Church Assessment Tool (CAT)**. This tool will enable us to collect and understand the range of views that exist at St. George's, and provide a clearer picture of who we are as a church and what directions might be important for our

future. The on-line assessment is available as of February 28th, and we ask that you take it as soon as possible, no later than **Friday, March 26th**. Your response is very important to us. All answers are strictly anonymous. We have no way of matching any assessment to a particular person, so please feel free to candidly share your perceptions, opinions, and experiences. Our ability to plan for our future together depends on everyone's participation and honest answers.

The assessment will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Please set aside enough time to complete the survey in one sitting, as you will **not** be able to submit or save a partially completed response. Also, please do not complete the survey more than once, even if you rethink some of your answers, as that will skew the results. Have each adult and young adult (age 14+) in your household complete the survey **separately**. Individual input is key to gaining insight into overall perceptions and experiences.



Lenten Series

Our traditional Wednesday evening Lenten Series continues, albeit somewhat differently this year! All are invited to enjoy a simple soup supper, using recipes sent out weekly by Ann if you wish to do so, and then join in a Zoom discussion at 7:00 pm every Wednesday during Lent. The goal is to be in community as best we can, and to think and pray together about how we are observing Lent 2021.

Each Wednesday evening will be geared around one of the five focus points we are delving into as part of our transitional work during this interim period. We began on Wednesday, February 24th with a focus on Heritage, and we are continuing on subsequent Wednesdays with discussions of Leadership, Connections, Mission, and Future. Weekly Eucharist

On **Sunday, March** 7th, we will begin holding a weekly in-person, outdoor Eucharist on **Sunday afternoons** at 12:15 pm. We have been unable to celebrate the Eucharist together for almost a year, and we're thrilled to begin doing so again! The services are limited to approximately 12 people and require registration. To attend, please <u>register online</u>. The service will last approximately 20-30 minutes and will be held at the rear of the playground. Communion will include distribution of the consecrated host only, not the wine. If you wish to sit, please bring your own chair; you are also welcome to stand. Masks and social distancing will be required.

Please bring a Book of Common Prayer or a device to access the **Eucharist online**. This service will not take the place of the 10:30 Liturgy of the Word, which will continue to be livestreamed each Sunday from the church.

Nineteen Steps to Calling a New Rector

Just as there are 19 steps in the Wright House up to the Rector's Office, there are 19 steps for the congregation going through the process of preparing for and calling a new rector. The whole congregation is invited to be part of the process of each of these 19 steps, the ultimate goal being the arrival of a newly called rector on Step 19! The steps are: 1. The Rector announces that s/he is leaving. ✓ 2. Supply clergy lead worship; work out interim priest arrangement. ✓ 3. The 2Interim priest arrives; work out Interim Rector. arrangement. ✓ 4. The Interim Rector arrives and begins transition work. 5. The congregation completes a <u>survey</u> provided by the diocese. (See page 3!) 6. The results of the survey are shared with the congregation. 7. The Parish Profile Committee is formed and generates a Parish Profile. 8. When the profile is ready, the diocese approves it. 9. The Profile is circulated locally and nationally for six to eight weeks. 10. The Search Committee is formed and prepares for interviews. 11. The Search Committee reviewing applications and holds interviews. 12. Zoom visits or (if safe and possible) in-person visits are held with the candidates. 13. The Search Committee narrows list to one or two finalists and presents them to the Vestry. 14. Throughout the work of the Parish Profile and Search Committees, transition and interim work are taking place. 15. The Vestry reviews the name(s) from the Search Committee.

18. A Transition Team is formed to welcome the new Rector and his/her family.

16. The Vestry votes to extend a call to one candidate.

17. A call goes out to the new Rector.

19. The new Rector arrives.

Words like "unprecedented" seem too small to describe the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, which has sorely afflicted the lives of millions of people around the world. It is hard to get one's mind around the impact of this crisis. And yet, for many Christians in the Middle East, the pandemic is just one more crisis to add to the list.

Reflecting upon the situation in Yemen, the Ven. Bill Schwartz, Archdeacon for the Gulf in the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf, writes: "The COVID crisis is actually only one more

difficulty for them in the face of three other ongoing epidemics (cholera, dengue fever, malaria) and all are greatly affected by all of the problems of the ongoing civil war."

In the Middle East, the political instability of countries like Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, and Yemen can overshadow all other concerns. Governments in turmoil continue to create conditions which promote poverty, food insecurity and economic instability which put a desperate strain on refugees and displaced persons, health care, education and family life in the best of times.

The Good Friday Offering is an opportunity throughout the Episcopal Church to support our Anglican sisters and brothers in their ministry to their neighbors to help meet the needs of innocent people caught in the middle of these realities.


