### Interim Rector's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

It's hard to believe that it's already June and summer is upon us! Last week, the electricity went out at my home for 24 hours; how quickly I was reminded of the difference between losing electricity in June as compared to a rare winter storm in February!

It may feel like we are not making a lot of progress during this time of transition, but we really are, on many fronts, some we never even considered! As of May, the vestry is once again meeting in person, on campus. It is important that the lay leadership be aware of changes and improvements to be able to lead the congregation through this time of returning to church and to the campus.

Not only the vestry, but all the congregation needs to be aware of some difficult times we have been through since April 28. The church has been broken into six times since then, almost certainly all by the same person. They have gained entry by breaking sections of stained glass, which have now been boarded up. The Paschal Candle was destroyed, and multiple items were stolen, including the white frontal, two fair linens, the two new candlestick holders, two of my personal chasubles, and multiple books. In response, we now have three cameras covering the front and back, and we have a temporary fence around the church property. (Those living under I-35 still have water access at the curb outside of the fence, but we no longer have any electric outlets on the outside of any buildings. This change was recommended by APD, our Bishop, and insurance company.) Then, on Friday, May 28<sup>th</sup>, Wright House was also broken into, and a few items were taken – a Bible, a pillow, and a soft drink! We now have a new camera covering the Wright House front porch area. As I mentioned in a sermon a couple of weeks ago, we will not be governed by fear, anxiety, or anger. We are taking some precautions, many of which are part of the daily routine for many churches.

In happier news, worshiping together in person and being back in the church on Sundays has been wonderful! It has been such a blessing to begin to meet some of you that I have only met on Zoom! As part of returning to church, lay ministries that have been on hiatus since last spring are now kicking into gear again, and we are taking the opportunity to implement a new system for scheduling and coordinating those ministries (see the article on page 5 for more information). Our 10:30 am Sunday morning service no longer requires online reservations, but we still ask worshipers to wear masks and maintain social distance. As conditions change, we are continuing to re-assess our practices for communion, congregational singing, and other elements of the service in light of health and safety concerns.

Throughout 2021, we have five focus points to help guide our transition process. We began with HERITAGE in February and March and moved on to LEADERSHIP in April and May. As we move into June, our focus shifts to the MISSION of the church. (The final two focus points will be CONNECTIONS and FUTURE.) As we move back on campus, our focus becomes our call to serve off campus!

In June, the school will be refurbishing Kleberg Hall with a new interior paint job and new flooring, and handing it back over to the church. In-person Coffee Hours in Kleberg will soon be a reality!

Back in March, many of you completed our Church Assessment Tool, a survey which collected information from parishioners about who we are and how we hope to develop in the future. In June, the results of the survey will be presented to the Vestry and then to the congregation (see the article on page 4 for more information). The Parish Profile Committee will use those results as they develop St. George's Parish Profile using an outline the diocese has in place. When the Profile has been completed and approved by the Bishop, we will be able to publicly announce the position as being open.

I invite everyone to hold St. George's, the transition process, and our campus and buildings in your prayers. God is preparing your next Rector. Trust in God.




## Wednesday Weavings

### Church Assessment Tool Presentation

Please join us on Thursday, June 17<sup>th</sup>, from 6:00-8:00 pm, via Zoom, for a presentation and discussion of the results of the Church Assessment Tool (CAT), the survey which was made available to all members of St. George's in March of this year. Representatives from Holy Cow Consulting, an organization that works with churches and other non-profits to conduct organizational assessments, will first present the results to the



Vestry and the Parish Profile Committee, and then to the whole congregation on June 17<sup>th</sup>. We want as many St. George's parishioners as possible to attend this event; it will include an opportunity to ask questions and share thoughts about what these results mean for our transition process and the next rector we will call to St. George's. We are very excited to be able to take this next step toward creating our Parish Profile!

## In-Person Worship

It's been wonderful to be back in the church and back together for Sunday morning worship. We hope that you can join us there! We are continuing to take measures to be safe, and our policies evolve as the situation changes. We are no longer requiring preregistration (we will re-assess if Austin's infection rate increases or if the attendance at the 10:30 service increases to unsafe levels). We ask that worshipers continue to wear masks and maintain social distance. As conditions change, we

are continuing to re-assess our practices for the distribution of communion, congregational singing, and other elements of the service in light of health and safety concerns.

The 10:30 service continues to be accessible via both Zoom and Facebook Live, so if you don't feel safe coming back to in-person church just yet or can't make it every Sunday, you can still worship with us!

### Ministry Leadership Teams

Most of our lay worship leaders have been on hiatus since last spring, when we stopped worshiping together in person. As part of returning to church in person, those ministries are now starting up again, and we are taking the opportunity to implement a new system for scheduling and coordinating those ministries. The members of the Altar Guild, Ushers, and Readers/Intercessors have been assigned to one of three teams – Teams A, B, and C – each



of which is scheduled to serve every third Sunday. Each team includes three or four members of each of the ministries, so not everyone on the team is expected to serve each time the team is scheduled. When a team is scheduled, its members communicate amongst themselves to determine which members will be serving on that particular Sunday. By having a simple, repeating schedule, this new system takes the burden of scheduling off the handful of individual people who've been doing it, in many cases for years, and redistributes it among all the members of these ministries. Each team makes its own decisions about how to divide up its responsibilities and can figure out the system that works best for them.

The team members are asked to let Jennifer know by noon on Thursday who will be serving on the upcoming Sunday, so that she can list them correctly in the "Those Who Serve" section of the bulletin.
