Interim Rector's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

As we come out on the other side of Fourth of July celebrations it is hard to believe that 2021 is half over! We are starting the second half of the year! In our Nineteen Steps towards calling a new rector (see the article on page 6), we are on Step 7: the Parish Profile Committee has been formed and plans to have a Profile in the next few weeks.

When the profile has been completed, it will be sent to the diocesan transition office for approval. With this approval, the position will be publicly announced, and the active search will begin. The timeline for this process is always different, as each congregation has different needs and attributes, and we are on schedule for our own process. Many thanks to the Profile Committee for their diligent work!



An update on our physical campus: Kleberg Hall has a new ceiling, all new interior paint, and a fresh new floor. On **Sunday, July 11th**, we will host our first Coffee Hour there since March 2020! This opportunity to once again be together and enjoy one another's company in Kleberg and the playground area is a moment of grace and celebration for us.

On July 11th, we will also welcome the choir back into the church and resume full congregational singing. Masks are required for those who have not been vaccinated and encouraged for those who have. We are also still maintaining social distance and sitting every other pew. Remember that we have children under 12 and members with health issues who cannot be vaccinated. If you are not yet vaccinated but could be, I would encourage you to do so, and to pray about this decision if you are uncertain.

In case you have not been by the campus lately, the fences around the Church and the Wright House are still up. The Austin Police Department is working on the case of the break-ins and thefts. We've sustained thousands of dollars of theft and damage between broken stained glass windows and doors, and stolen altar linens, vestments, computer and sound equipment, candlestick holders, offering plates, and more. We are taking advantage of this time period to have some work done on the church building, and we are in the process of getting estimates for some of the repair work.

Although we believe that the break-ins and damage have all been done by one person, the five cameras around the campus have shown us just how much is going on during all hours of the day and night on this campus! Unfortunately, quite a few people regularly dispose of trash on our grounds, which I often pick up. But we have also learned from the cameras that many neighbors use our campus to walk their dogs or just take walks with their families, and we want to keep that option open, safe, and available.

On **Sunday, September 19th**, Bishop Jeff Fisher will be with us for an official Episcopal visit. If anyone would like to be baptized or confirmed, this would be a wonderful Sunday to take advantage of those sacraments. If you are interested, please contact me at **769-257-2377** or mclemore.a@gmail.com, and I would be delighted to meet with you. (Please hold off on choosing godparents until we've had the opportunity to discuss their role and responsibilities.)

Speaking of sacraments, St. George's is very proud of The Rev. Joel McAlister, who was ordained a deacon on June 26th at Christ Church Cathedral in Houston, where I served as one of his presenters. In approximately six months Joel will be ordained a priest. Joel and Laura were members of St. George's and we have been his sponsoring parish throughout his ordination process. Congratulations, Joel!

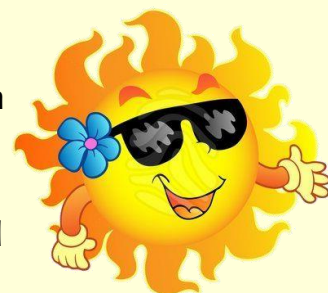

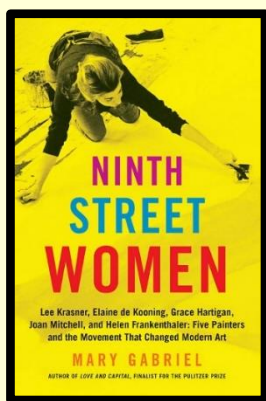

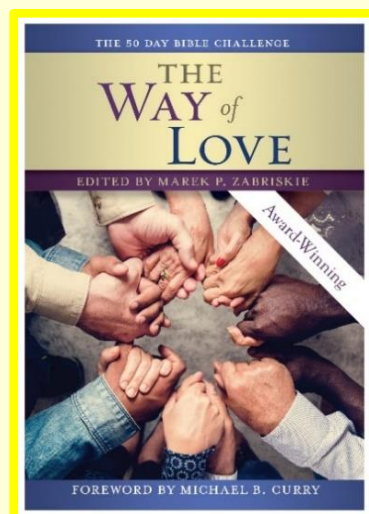

Wednesday Weavings

St. George's adult discussion group continues to meet every other Wednesday. In July, we plan to have one in-person meeting and one Zoom meeting, On **July 14th**, we will gather in the front room of the **Wright-Giles House from 6:30 to 8:00 pm** for a bring-your-own supper (optional), a discussion on the selected reading for the evening, and Compline service. On **July 28th**, we will meet **via Zoom from 7:00 to 8:00 pm**. We may continue to use this hybrid approach for the time being, so as to ensure that as many who want to participate can continue to do so. We will solicit feedback and continue to assess how best to move forward as we go along.



We are continuing our study of *The Way of Love*, a Forward Movement publication edited by Marek Zabriskie. The book offers 50 meditations, each consisting of a Scripture reading, reflection, discussion questions, and prayer. The meditations are divided into seven sections based on seven spiritual practices for a Jesus-centered life: Turn, Learn Pray, Worship, Bless, Go, and Rest. Frances Rickard will send out the reading before each meeting, as well as the Zoom invitation for the 28th, to the group's email list. In-Person Worship



It's been wonderful to be back in the church and back together for Sunday morning worship. We hope that you can join us there! We are continuing to take measures to be safe, and our policies evolve as the situation changes. We continue to practice social distancing, but masks are now optional (but encouraged) for those who have been vaccinated, and we are no longer requiring pre-registration. We have begun to go forward to the altar rail to receive communion. As of Sunday, July 11th, we will welcome the choir back to the church in person, and we will once again allow full congregational singing.

The 10:30 service continues to be accessible via both Zoom and Facebook Live, so if you don't feel safe coming back to in-person church just yet or can't make it every Sunday, you can still worship with us!

New Organ for St. George's

In December 2019, we reported that St. George's was looking at replacing our existing organ with a computerized digital organ. Feedback from the announcement was positive, so we started moving in that direction, until the diocese requested that all capital improvement projects be halted as we focused attention on "doing and being church" during the global pandemic. During 2020, our organ continued to deteriorate; Music Minister Mi-Young Kim is no longer able to play it for our services. As we



are emerging from the pandemic, capital improvements are allowed once again, and the Vestry has approved the installation of a new Hauptwerk digital pipe organ for St. George's.

Danny Brooke, with Organ Technology, is completing the adaption of a Galanti organ console for us. As you can see in the accompanying photo, it is a walnut console, with three new keyboards and touch screens installed. The full system includes the console, pedals, a computer, Hauptwerk software, and studio-quality speakers. Although the system does not use pipes to make the sound, some of our organ pipes will remain in place for aesthetic purposes. In addition to the console, some construction work will be needed to install the speakers, make other adjustments to the back of the sanctuary, and remove the current organ console. Nineteen Steps to Calling a New Rector

Just as there are 19 steps in the Wright House up to the Rector's Office, there are 19 steps for the congregation going through the process of preparing for and calling a new rector. The whole congregation is invited to be part of the process of each of these 19 steps, the ultimate goal being the arrival of a newly called rector on Step 19! The steps are:



- 1. The Rector announces that s/he is leaving.
- 2. Supply clergy lead worship; work out interim priest arrangement.
- 3. The Interim priest arrives; work out Interim Rector arrangement.
- 4. The Interim Rector arrives and begins transition work.
- 5. The congregation completes a survey provided by the diocese.
- 6. The results of the survey are shared with the congregation.
- 7. The Parish Profile Committee is formed and generates a Parish Profile.
- 8. When the profile is ready, the diocese approves it.
- 9. The Profile is circulated locally and nationally for six to eight weeks.
- 10. The Search Committee is formed and prepares for interviews.
- 11. The Search Committee reviews applications and holds interviews.
- 12. Zoom visits or (if safe and possible) in-person visits are held with the candidates.
- 13. The Search Committee narrows list to one or two finalists and presents them to the Vestry.
- 14. Throughout the work of the Parish Profile and Search Committees, transition and interim work are taking place.
- 15. The Vestry reviews the name(s) from the Search Committee.
- 16. The Vestry votes to extend a call to one candidate.
- 17. A call goes out to the new Rector.
- 18. A Transition Team is formed to welcome the new Rector and his/her family.
- 19. The new Rector arrives.

Church Assessment Tool Presentation



Thanks to all who attended the recent presentation by Holy Cow Consulting, summarizing the results of the Church Assessment Tool (CAT), the survey made available to all members of St. George's in March (see steps 5 and 6 above). If you were not able to attend, the session was recorded, and you can view it at this link: www.tinyurl.com/5bepdhma. The next step in our search for a new rector will be for the Profile Committee (made up of Sarah Campbell, Mary Stewart Miller, Frances Rickard, and Brad Barcus) to prepare our Parish Profile about our parish history, ministries and programs, budget, parish life, and goals. The profile will then be made available to clergy who may be interested in a call to serve as our rector.

Ministry Leadership Teams

Most of our lay worship leaders were on hiatus from March 2020, when we stopped worshipping together in person, until we began to do so again in April of this year. As these ministries begin to function again, we are taking the opportunity to implement a new system for scheduling and coordination. The members of the Altar Guild, Ushers, and Readers/Intercessors have been assigned to one of three teams – Teams A, B, and C – each of which is



scheduled to serve every third Sunday. Each team includes three or four members of each of the ministries, so not everyone on the team is expected to serve each time the team is scheduled. When a team is scheduled, its members communicate amongst themselves to determine which members will be serving on that particular Sunday. By having a simple, repeating schedule, this new system takes the burden of scheduling off the handful of individual people who've been doing it, in many cases for years, and redistributes it among all the members of these ministries. Each team makes its own decisions about how to divide up its responsibilities and can figure out the system that works best for them.

The team members are asked to let Jennifer know by noon on Thursday who will be serving on the upcoming Sunday, so that she can list them correctly in the "Those Who Serve" section of the bulletin. Outreach Ministry Highlight for July: HELPS International



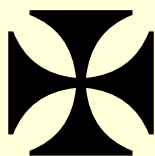
HELPS International works to address the root causes of poverty in Guatemala by focusing on four key areas: agriculture, community development, education, and health care. St. George's involvement with HELPS has been primarily with the educational aspect of their work. The barriers Guatemalan children face to make it into classrooms are very high, and most children receive only four years of formal education. For several years, the St. George's Women's Book Group has sponsored a child in the village of Santa Avelina to attend HELPS International's elementary school there. In more recent years, the parish's partnership with HELPS has expanded to include financial and hands-on support for a spring field trip for fifth graders to visit the university, trade school, and museums in a neighboring city to inspire them to continue their education and break the cycle of poverty. 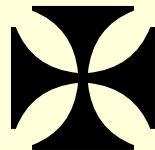
