Interim Rector's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

As the summer begins to wind down, vacations come to an end, and plans for a new school year are launched, it is hard to believe how much progress we have made in some areas and how other parts of our lives seem to be on hold, or even moving backwards!

First of all, an update on our progress towards calling a new rector: The Profile Team is finishing up their work, and we hope for the Parish Profile to be presented and approved at the August vestry meeting, after which we will pass it along to the diocese. Once the diocese gives the green light, the position will be advertised, and we will receive applications for four to eight weeks. When that time period is completed, the Search Committee will begin reviewing the applications and making arrangements for visits, interviews, listening to sermons, etc. When the Search Committee settles on one or two candidates, those names will be passed on to the Vestry. At that point, the vestry will decide on making a call to a candidate. With an acceptance, we will work out a timetable for the arrival of the new rector and a start date. We will then create a Transition Team to help the newly called rector and their family settle in. This may be in the form of suggesting realtors, helping with the move itself, making introductions to people at the church, meeting with different committees, and help them get to know Austin.

We still have some slots on the Search Committee and on the Transition Team. If you are interested in learning more or serving on one of these teams, please contact Brad Dieringer, our Senior Warden (at 512-992-6461 or bradd77tx@gmail.com), or me (at 769-257-2377 or mclemore.a@gmail.com).

In campus news, ground has been broken for the construction site of the new building for the St. George's School! This has been a long time coming, and we hope to have construction and assembly completed by late September or early October. At that point, everything being temporarily stored in the POD in the parking lot will be unpacked and arranged in the new building.

We are waiting for the new estimates for replacing and reframing the damaged stained glass windows. We also have glass work that needs to be done in the Wright House, and the Wright House's back door needs to be replaced. Altar items that were stolen or damaged have been inventoried, we have gotten replacement costs, and we have begun the replacement process with an order for a new set of altar candlesticks. In order to prevent further damage to our buildings, access to electricity on the outside of campus buildings was completely removed, but we are still making water accessible outside the fence around the church. Unfortunately, we have found that the availability of the water has at times been abused; on more than one occasion, it's been left running in the street for extended periods of time. I want us to be able to keep this water available to our neighbors, particularly in this hot season, but we may have to revisit this issue if it continues to be abused.

The city has been doing some work near our campus and parking heavy equipment under I-35 across from the church. Access to Ardenwood and Crestwood Streets has at times been restricted. This, too, is impacting the homeless encampment directly across from the church, and the number of people there has decreased.

Thank you for your patience each Sunday as we try our best to keep everyone as safe and healthy as possible. This sometimes means last-minute decisions. Singing is one part of our liturgy that we all enjoy, but it is a major spreader of COVID. For the time being, as COVID numbers rise, we will decide week-to-week if we will include singing in the service. We are also still social distancing during services, which affects where worshipers can sit. When you pick a pew to sit in, please ONLY sit in pews with bulletins – we are using bulletins to indicate which pews are available and which should be left empty to maintain social distancing, including space around the choir, the tech team, and the worship leaders. As we find ourselves once again in Stage Five, we are again requiring that all worshipers wear masks. If you are not vaccinated, I ask that you pray about this decision and the impact that it has on others.

Special thanks to Alice for setting up the coffee hour on Sunday, August 1st, on the Wright House front porch, with cold, refreshing drinks! We will continue to enjoy our coffee hour refreshments and fellowship outside for the time being.





Regardless of whether Coffee Hour is inside or outside, we need hosts! We're asking that two or three households



The Rev. John W. Price, former rector of St. George's, has died in Houston following a long illness. He was rector from 1968 to 1988, during which time he oversaw significant growth in the parish and school and led the church into broad participation in the renewal movement. He is survived by his wife Arlene and their three children Rob, Rick, and Catherine, all of whom grew up at St. George's. His funeral will be on August 21st, at Palmer Memorial Episcopal Church in Houston, and his ashes will be interred here at St. George's on September 19th, when Bishop Jeff Fisher is with us.

The Bishop Is Coming!

The Right Reverend Jeff Fisher, Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of Texas, will be with us at St. George's on **Sunday, September 19**th. All four bishops in our diocese spend much of their time with congregations throughout the diocese in order to provide whatever support and guidance the parishioners and clergy need, and to maintain connections between the various parishes of our far-flung diocese. While here, the bishop will preside and preach at the Eucharist, as well as (if needed) administer the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation and preside at the rites of Reception and Reaffirmation of Faith (BCP, pages 412-419). The sacrament of **Confirmation** is a mature, public reaffirmation of the Christian faith and of the promises made at one's baptism. It is administered by a bishop because bishops serve as symbols of the wider Church and its continuity throughout the centuries. Confirmations performed in most other Christian traditions are considered valid in the Episcopal Church, so those confirmed in such a tradition who now wish to join the Episcopal Church do not need to be confirmed again. They may participate in the rite of **Reception**, in which an Episcopal Bishop receives them into the Episcopal Church. At times, adult members of the Episcopal Church wish to publicly reaffirm their faith, either because they've returned to the church after a period of absence, or because they've come to a new understanding of their faith which they wish to acknowledge liturgically. The rite of **Reaffirmation** provides an opportunity to do so with the blessing of a bishop, and may be repeated as many times as one feels called to do so.

Ministry Leadership Teams

Most of our lay worship leaders were on hiatus for over a year. As part of returning to church in person, we are taking the opportunity to implement a new system for scheduling and coordinating those ministries. The members of the Altar Guild, Ushers, and Readers/Intercessors have been assigned to one of three teams – Teams A, B, and C – each of which is scheduled to serve every third Sunday. Each team includes three

or four members of each of the ministries, so not everyone on the team is expected to serve each time the team is scheduled. When a team is scheduled, its members communicate amongst themselves to determine which members will be serving on that particular Sunday. By having a simple, repeating schedule, this new system takes the burden of scheduling off the handful of individual people who've been doing it, in many cases for years, and redistributes it among all the members of these ministries. Each team makes its own decisions about how to divide up its responsibilities and can figure out the system that works best for them.

The team members are asked to let Jennifer know by noon on Thursday who will be serving on the upcoming Sunday, so that she can list them correctly in the "Those Who Serve" section of the bulletin. News from the School

Austin Energy mistakenly approved an application in late April for a new meter pole and then realized they needed more information, so this could cause a two- to three-month delay. The information has been given to them, but they said it puts us at the end of the line now. Needless to say, this is very frustrating. The groundwork is still moving forward, and the building is in production. It just might sit without power for a while when it arrives. I'll keep you posted on how that is going.

Otherwise, the school is full, 93 children enrolled, and we have 78 children on the waitlist – our largest waiting list to date. When the building opens, we will be able to enroll an additional 24 students. Please continue to keep us in your prayers as we limp to the finish line of the project.

The school's summer camp program is in its final 3 weeks. We will be closed to children during the week of August 23rd, but the staff will be here for a teacher in-service week. I hope you are all having a great summer and are gearing up for a peaceful school year.
