Interim Rector's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

Greetings,

Happy New Year! Yes, it is hard to believe that we are now in the year 2022! As of the 11th we are back to green altar linens and vestments as we enter into the season of Epiphany. And so we begin the business of the New Year, this new season! At the January vestry meeting the vestry passed a 2022 budget which will be presented at the annual meeting.

Sunday, January 30, is our annual congregational meeting which will take place immediately following the 10:30 service, in the church. By having the annual meeting in the church, those who attended church by virtual means can stay tuned and attend the meeting using the same virtual capabilities. Also, by hosting the annual meeting in the church, those present can see and hopefully understand better all the work that has been taking place at the church this past year and beginning of the new year. There has been some delayed maintenance that was sorely needing attention. The current vestry leadership and I felt it important to take care of these issues now rather than pushing them down the road for "others" to worry about for the future of the physical structures. Among this work was updating the Altar Guild room, which now has a new refrigerator that is more efficient in both space usage and energy.

Special thanks to Dale Curry and Elaine Hosage for all their work in the expansion of the Memorial Garden. Next time you are at the church take a few minutes to walk through the garden area. The landscaping around the south and north sides of the church have been manicured and now will no longer be drainage factors to the stained glass wood framing. Three new air conditioning/heating units have been installed in the church; these are incredible assets in moving air and moderating the temperature; the old system was beyond repair!

On the other side of the campus, work has started on the Wright House replacing the back door and areas where the wood was rotting and damage from the break-ins. Roof issues are also being addressed. The new school building is going through the final check list and should be ready for occupancy in February.

That is our "physical" part of church! On the human resource side; we all should be so grateful for the work that Mikail McIntosh-Doty is taking on as the new church office manager. Dia Parks is becoming more and more confident with our Episcopal liturgy offering her musical talents to our Sunday morning worship. This past Monday, at the January vestry meeting, our Eucharist honored the three vestry members that are rotating off: Rob Blech, Ed Crawford, and Samantha Stephens. A grateful thank-you to them and their three years of service. We also thank Hye Na Lucy for her time served! Our new candidates for vestry are Sandra Villalaz-Dickson, Ramon Trevino, Spencer Gordon and Brad Barcus.

Our 12-member search committee, chaired by Melissa Brackin, is moving along and doing their due diligence in the process towards presenting the vestry with a candidate(s) in the calling of a new rector for St. George's. We are all grateful for the time, energy and effort these folks are putting in, under the direction of the Holy Spirit. Please continue to hold them in your prayers, along with the priest that God is preparing for serving at and with the good people of St. George's.

Brad Dieringer, Spencer Gordon, Mary Stewart Miller, and Frances Rickard are the four delegates representing St. George's at the February 25, 26 Annual Diocesan Convention being held in The Woodlands. I will also be attending with them as Interim Rector. Being

that I am still canonically resident in the Diocese of Mississippi; I have seat and voice; but, no vote.

We have temporarily put a hold on coffee hour until Austin is out of Stage Five COVID-19 conditions. When the weather is nice, we can visit after church outside. In the church we are back to blocking off two rows of pews, leaving every third pew for seating. Communion is being offered to you in the pew, only using the hosts. I ask that you continue to wear masks during the service.

Ash Wednesday is still a way off: March 2. A lot will take place between now and then here at St. George's! So as we continue in 2022 let us offer our gratefulness to God for his love, his grace, and his patience with each and every one of us!

The Feast of the Epiphany


With the Feast of the Epiphany, on Wednesday, January 6th, the 12-day season of Christmas draws to a close, and the church moves into the season of Epiphany. The Word *epiphany* comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, which means "appearing" or "revealing." The season of Epiphany focuses on God's self-revelation in Christ. Christian tradition pays special attention to the gradual revelation of Christ's nature as shown in three events: the visit of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and the Wedding at Cana where he performed his first miracle, changing water into wine. With each of these events, the circle of those who see and recognize Jesus for who he is – God

with us – grows larger. And with this revelation, the promise of Christmas begins to be fulfilled, as the light of Christ enters the world: "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you" (Isaiah 60:1). God is always making God's-self known to us. The Season of Epiphany lasts until March 2nd this year with Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent.

Our traditional annual evening liturgy of Epiphany at Casa Marianella (821 Gunter Street) was

cancelled due to high levels of Covid spread in the community. We look forward to renewing this tradition next January. In the meantime, Suzette Puckett passed out Epiphany packets to those of us attending the church in person so that we can do our own Epiphany blessing of updating the lintel markings at our homes. Annual Parish Meeting

The reason for holding the meeting in the church is so that those who attended the service virtually may also participate in the Annual Meeting virtually. Since the church is equipped for transmission and filming it makes sense to go ahead and have this necessary, but short meeting in the church. Another reason for holding the Annual Meeting in the church is so everyone can see and learn about all the



major repairs and work around the physical plant that have taken place, particularly over the past three months. The work was initially instigated because of the eight break-ins; however, the silver lining to all of this undertaking has been the discovery of areas that were long overdue for maintenance and/or replacement. There will also be a display of security options.

Nineteen Steps to Calling a New Rector

Just as there are 19 steps in the Wright House up to the Rector's Office, there are 19 steps for the congregation going through the process of preparing for and calling a new rector. The whole congregation is invited to be part of the process of each of these 19 steps, the ultimate goal being the arrival of a newly called rector on Step 19! The steps are:

		these 19 steps, the ultimate goal being the arrival vly called rector on Step 19! The steps are:
$\overline{\mathbf{V}}$	1.	The Rector announces that s/he is leaving.
√	2.	Supply clergy lead worship; work out interim priest arrangement.
V	3.	The Interim priest arrives; work out Interim Rector arrangement.
V	4.	The Interim Rector arrives and begins transition work.
$\overline{\mathbf{V}}$	5.	The congregation completes a survey provided by the diocese.
$\overline{\mathbf{V}}$	6.	The results of the survey are shared with the congregation.
V	7.	The Parish Profile Committee is formed and generates a Parish Profile.
V	8.	When the profile is ready, the diocese approves it.
V	9.	The Profile is circulated locally and nationally for six to eight weeks.
V	10.	The Search Committee is formed and prepares for interviews.
V	11.	The Search Committee reviews applications and holds interviews.
V	12.	Zoom visits or (if safe and possible) in-person visits are held with the candidates.
	13.	The Search Committee narrows the list to one or two finalists and presents them to the Vestry.
	14.	Throughout the work of the Parish Profile and Search Committees, transition and interim work are taking place.
	15.	The Vestry reviews the name(s) from the Search Committee.
	16.	The Vestry votes to extend a call to one candidate.
	17.	A call goes out to the new Rector.
	18.	A Transition Team is formed to welcome the new Rector and his/her family.

Special update from Carolyn Moreau about our efforts with El Buen's Turkey Drive:

St. George's raised \$1,940 for the Hands for Hope Thanksgiving event. A 1,800 local families were served as part of **El Buen's Hands for Hope (H4H) Food Equity and Access Campaign.** The week of November 15th, 800 families of our partner organizations received vouchers to purchase Thanksgiving meal items, and on that Saturday 1000 families received Thanksgiving meal kits, including all of the essentials to cook a holiday meal, with enough to share with friends and family. Another 500 families will receive a meal kit in December at their other annual event, Posadas at El Buen!
