Dear St. George's Family:

Greetings,

Easter is a season! It is still Easter and yet we hurry along with our lives, our filling calendars. Our readings from the Gospel throughout Easter are attempts to prepare us, just as the disciples were being prepared to be reinforced by their teacher, their Lord, their friend, Jesus.

Jesus made sure that the apostles understood through his post-crucifixion appearances that that what was promised has transpired! Yet, the disciples (like us) were reminded that the ultimate coming back, returning, of Christ is a date in the future unknown to any of us. And, that is a good thing. In that light, we are called to live lives that are our best attempts to be walking in the footsteps of Jesus.

As we walk in these footsteps do we find ourselves stretching and accommodating to be exactly in the footprints; or, do we do our best to walk with our prints side-by-side with the prints of Jesus?

Once again, we turn to our Catechism, "We recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit when we confess Jesus Christ as Lord and are brought into love and harmony with God, with ourselves, with our neighbors, and with all creation."

Love and harmony with all creation, our neighbors, and with one another—that is our effort, our homework to prepare for the Pentecost season of summer! My prayer is that each and every one of you are able to take this assignment seriously. For if you do, I believe you will see a change in your lives!




Wednesday Weavings

Our Outreach Ministry Highlight for the month of May is the **SAFE Alliance.** The SAFE Alliance exists to stop abuse for everyone by serving the survivors of child abuse, sexual assault and

exploitation, and domestic violence. They work to ending violence through prevention, advocacy, and comprehensive services for individuals, families, and communities that have been affected by abuse. Our primary ministry with them is creating approximately 450 comfort bags each year, to be given to women and men who are undergoing clinical exams for and official reports of sexual assault.

Christopher House Baskets/Bags



Delivery people needed! St. George's has a long-standing ministry of delivering hospitality baskets to the families of patients at Christopher House. As with everything else, the logistics of this have changed with the pandemic, but we continue to deliver baskets, and we need more delivery people! CH has said they are getting more families that are coming to the facility and are in need now of two (2) bags per week. So the

weekly donation is now \$20 and you take two bags to CH on your assigned day.

To be a part of this ministry, sign up for one or more weeks between now and June on the Online Christopher House Basket Calendar. A \$10 donation is requested per bag/basket (\$20 for two bags), and you can also add a note and other goodies (nothing perishable). You can make the donation online via the St. George's Donation Page under Outreach look for the "Christopher House" tile, or by mailing a check to the church office, made out to "St. George's Episcopal Church," with "Christopher House Baskets" in the memo line. Then, contact Alice Nelson at mzlsnlsn@gmail.com to make arrangements to get a basket before your delivery week. Delivery includes no patient contact, and only brief outdoor and masked contact with a staff member.

Pentecost on June 5th

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.

~ Acts 2:2-3

The Day of Pentecost recalls the coming of the Holy Spirit to the first disciples of Jesus, empowering them to preach the gospel to people from many different places, backgrounds, and cultures. The disciples who had formerly been confused and frightened after the Ascension of Jesus, not knowing what to do without his physical presence among them, were emboldened by the Spirit, and began to

form a community that would be able to carry on in these new circumstances. Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church for this reason. As the contemporary embodiment of the community those first disciples began, we celebrate the fruits of the Spirit in each of us and the sharing of our gifts with our community and the world.

Join us on the Day of Pentecost, Sunday, June 5th, – <u>online</u> or <u>in person</u> – as we celebrate the presence of the Holy Spirit among us. We will join together in reading the gospel in languages from around the globe. It is traditional to **wear red** on Pentecost – even if you're at home! – so that the congregation itself becomes a symbol of the flames of the Holy Spirit.

News from the School

Once again, our campus has sprung to life with the outdoor beauty it holds. I love this time of year here at St. George's. I think it might also have something to do with when I started here 8 years ago (May 1, 2014). The moment I stepped foot on this campus, I knew it was special.

I have much to tell you this month. First, let me start with thanking the School Board and church members for their attendance at A Knight for St. George's. We had a wonderful time together. The event was very successful, after a three-year hiatus. It was very touching to see the parents, staff, church

members, and school board members socializing and connecting. I had many parents and teachers (new to our school), beam with pride as they saw what I've been trying to describe and what makes us so special.

The event raised \$9,500. So, together with the other monies raised this year, the school has \$30,000 to spend on our toddler playground renovations. Every year the parents vote on how they want their fundraising money spent and we all decided it's time to "beef" up the toddler playground. I also want to share another blessing the school received. The federal government is still providing grant money for child care centers, who were hit hard during the pandemic. Many schools have had to close their doors, so there's an even greater shortage of quality child care. I'm happy to report that St. George's received a \$532,000 grant.

This grant money will be used to pay off our building loan, replenish the school's reserves, and increase teacher salaries. And perhaps, if agreed by all stakeholders, there will be money to start on the sculpture garden. A vision I have to surround the Beinecke Building with a butterfly and sculpture garden for our families, children, and parishioners to enjoy. As well as honor Bridgette for all her hard work and dedication to this project.

Nineteen Steps to Calling a New Rector

Just as there are 19 steps in the Wright House up to the Rector's Office, there are 19 steps for the congregation going through the process of preparing for and calling a new rector. The whole congregation is invited to be part of the process of each of these 19 steps, the ultimate goal being the arrival of a newly called rector on Step 19! The steps are:

		these 19 steps, the ultimate goal being the arrival vly called rector on Step 19! The steps are:
V	1.	The Rector announces that s/he is leaving.
V	2.	Supply clergy lead worship; work out interim priest arrangement.
V	3.	The Interim priest arrives; work out Interim Rector arrangement.
V	4.	The Interim Rector arrives and begins transition work.
V	5.	The congregation completes a survey provided by the diocese.
V	6.	The results of the survey are shared with the congregation.
V	7.	The Parish Profile Committee is formed and generates a Parish Profile.
V	8.	When the profile is ready, the diocese approves it.
V	9.	The Profile is circulated locally and nationally for six to eight weeks.
V	10.	The Search Committee is formed and prepares for interviews.
V	11.	The Search Committee reviewing applications and holds interviews.
V	12.	Zoom visits or (if safe and possible) in-person visits are held with the candidates.
V	13.	The Search Committee narrows list to one or two finalists and presents them to the Vestry.
V	14.	Throughout the work of the Parish Profile and Search Committees, transition and interim work are taking place.
	15.	The Vestry reviews the name(s) from the Search Committee.
	16.	The Vestry votes to extend a call to one candidate.
	17.	A call goes out to the new Rector.
V	18.	A Transition Team is formed to welcome the new Rector and his/her family.
