Our "incoming" Rector's Corner

Tyler Behind Me, Austin Before Me. Christ Behind Me, Christ Before Me.

With that second line of the above title intended to evoke the great hymn St. Patrick's Breastplate (sung at my ordination to the diaconate about twelve years ago, with my friend Kevin Schubert on jimbe), I am mindful these days that with Tyler behind me, Christ is behind me ... and with Austin before me, Christ is before me.



In that spirit, I thought I'd share my answer to a frequent question I've been getting here in Tyler: "Father Matt, what is it that draws you to St. George's in Austin?" My stock answer has evolved to include the deep affection I experienced with the search committee and the vestry, the commitment that the church has to serving others with the love of Christ, and finally the huge opportunity for St. George's to thrive in the future.

Regarding this last point, I have spoken about St. George's School and the Mueller neighborhood, St. George's Court and the local vibe/environs of the area around the church, often summarizing things in the following way: "Literally twenty yards to the west we have homeless folks sleeping under I-35, and ten miles to the east is Elon Musk's Tesla "Giga" world headquarters. So, we have the poorest of the poor, and the richest of the rich, and everyone in between." Sounds like the Body of Christ to me!

I sometimes add that the search committee "high fived" me when I said that I plan to be 60% rector and 40% evangelist. Huge opportunities, indeed. This comprises what you might call my "elevator speech."

For those who want to go a bit deeper, perhaps over coffee or a beer, I share about HeartEdge. HeartEdge, you see, is a community of church practitioners founded by the Rev. Dr. Samuel Wells, vicar of St. Paul's Church in London (right across from Trafalgar Square, for those familiar with the city). HeartEdge is a network that "embraces those shaped by habits of pastoral ministry, fostering in them an aptitude and appetite for translating these interests into compassionate, cultural and commercial opportunities." Those last three adjectives are related to the "Four C's" of HeartEdge: *Commerce, Compassion, Culture, and Congregation*. I lack the space here to develop these four areas; suffice it to say that I'm beginning to dream of them in the context of St. George's & its social & geographic situation in Austin. (Two more quickies: if you'd like to discuss Wells' book with me, check out Sam Well's A *Future that's Bigger than the Past*; or, check out his youtube videos. Just google "youtube Sam Wells Being With" and you will find my faves!)


Finally, I often share one final piece in my response to the question my Tyler friends ask about St. George's. I mention the challenges. Challenges like the cumulative exhaustion due to the lack of a rector, challenges like boarded up stained glass windows & a security fence surrounding the church. (Man oh man: you should see the facial expressions in response to these last two!) But then I remind them: when a challenge presents itself, an opportunity lies right around the corner. That's no cliché, and in fact I'd put it even more strongly: the greater the challenge, the greater the opportunity.

What beautiful story is emerging with these challenges? I cannot wait to find out, and to help write that narrative!

Wednesday Weavings



St. George's Episcopal School, an outreach ministry of St. George's Church, strives to provide a well-rounded program for the children of the church and its surrounding diverse community. Our programs help each child grow and develop spiritually, cognitively, physically, emotionally, and socially, all within a Christian atmosphere. We believe each child is a gift of God, a unique person valued for his/her own worth, growing and learning independently. 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News from the School

The Summer Camp program is coming to a close, and it was a great success - - hot, but successful. The children enjoyed splash days, Kona Ice, The Hot Dog King food truck, science shows, a foam party, and so much more.

My focus is now on starting up another school year. We are comfortably in the Beinecke Building and the fence is up and secure. With the help of volunteers from the parish, we are moving the library books and toys into the new resource rooms. The school will now have 9 classrooms (all of which are full, except for a couple of T/Th spots). Now it's time to finish the hiring and train the staff. The school will have 28 employees with half being brand new, so I'm embarking on an extensive training program.

The additional grant money the school received is helping to train the new teachers, increase salaries, and offer gas stipends. Here are some of the exciting training opportunities the staff has had so far:

- 2 teachers went to the JW Marriott Hill Country Resort in San Antonio and spent 2 nights and 2 days receiving excellent training and pampering.
- 2 teachers spent a week in Houston at Rice University's Glasscock School of Continuing Studies Storytelling and Culture Project. It's a wonderful program that will strengthen our literacy curriculum.
- 3 teachers are scheduled to go to the Texas Association for the Education of Young Children's Annual Conference in San Antonio on the riverwalk. There they will spend 3 nights and 3 days receiving excellent training.
- And for team building, I have a motivational speaker set to kick off our teacher inservice week.

I will continue to seek out high quality trainings and conduct many myself in order to bring the new staff up to the standards St. George's Episcopal School is known for. The tenured staff is also eager to help train, mentor and coach as we kick off another new year.

The school has a lot to be thankful for, so here's to another great year!

The Bishop Is Coming!

The Right Reverend Kathryn "Kai" Ryan, Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of Texas, will be with us at St. George's on **Sunday, August 28**th. All four bishops in our diocese spend much of their time with congregations throughout the diocese in order to provide whatever support and guidance the parishioners and clergy need, and to maintain connections between the various parishes of our far-flung diocese (which, with the addition of the folks from the former Diocese of Fort Worth, is getting even bigger). While here, the bishop will preside and preach at the Eucharist, as well as administer the sacraments of Baptism and preside at the rite of Reaffirmation of Faith

(BCP, pages 412-419) for two of our members. Please contact Senior Warden Brad Dieringer at **bradd77tx@gmail.com** or the church office if you are interested in participating in any of these rites. Listed below are all the rites, beyond baptism, that the bishop presides over:

The sacrament of **Confirmation** is a mature, public reaffirmation of the Christian faith and of the promises made at one's baptism. It is administered by a bishop because bishops serve as symbols of the wider Church and its continuity throughout the centuries. Confirmations performed in most other Christian traditions are considered valid in the Episcopal Church, so those confirmed in such a tradition who now wish to join the Episcopal Church do not need to be confirmed again. They may participate in the rite of **Reception**, in which an Episcopal Sishop receives them into the Episcopal Church. At times, adult members of the Episcopal Church wish to publicly reaffirm their faith, either because they've returned to the church after a period of absence, or because they've come to a new understanding of their faith which they wish to acknowledge liturgically. The rite of **Reaffirmation** provides an opportunity to do so with the blessing of a bishop and may be repeated as many times as one feels called to do so.



Replaced side glass panel for front door.





We have recently received two generous bequests from former parishioners: one from the estate of Ruth Crawford, which will go primarily toward completing the interior and exterior paneling on the sanctuary; and the other from Mary Parker, who designated the St. George's Music Program as the beneficiary of an annuity. Those gifts are not represented in the statement below.

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
