The practice of being a follower of Christ is a journey in faith. I am extremely appreciative of the journey we have had over the years, and I look forward to seeing what is in store for St. George's in the future. Over the past ten years we have built upon a sure foundation of grace, justice, and love; and along the way we have overcome great obstacles. I believe that together we have stabilized our church both financially and communally. Having accomplished what I believe I was called to do at St. George's, it is now the occasion for a new person to be called to lead you to the next level of stability. I truly believe that St. George's is ripe with opportunity and is strongly grounded in the faith providing the opportunity for fruitful years to come.

I recognize that along the journey of faith God does not always call us to what is comfortable, safe, or easy. This is very apparent, especially during these trying times of a global pandemic. For several months (well before the pandemic began) I have been discerning with God what is best for myself, my family, and St. George's. Though our current context is difficult, I am filled with hope and peace with this decision. I pray that you may join with me in that hope.

Because of our current context, our departure may be more difficult than normal. I would give anything to see you all in person to say goodbye, but unfortunately this is not possible. My last Sunday at St. George's will be on August 16th. I hope that between now and then I can have numerous phone conversations with you to exchange our goodbyes. From the Senior Warden

As Father Kevin has announced to the congregation and explains in his Rector's Corner above, he will be ending his time as the Rector of St. George's this month. Being in transition can be a frightening position for a church, but the Episcopal Church and the Diocese of Texas have procedures in place to help guide us through it. I am already in conversation with the Canon to the Ordinary about this process.



First, in consultation with the vestry, the Diocese will assign an Interim Rector to St. George's. The Interim Rector should be in place with us by the end of the month. They will cover all the duties of a rector, probably on a full-time basis.

Next, the vestry will create a Search Committee. The Search Committee will begin their work by conducting a parish self-study and creating a parish profile. This profile will look inward at who St. George's is – our history, our mission, our current ministries, our finances, our strengths and weaknesses, our needs, our hopes and goals. The purpose of creating a parish profile is to help us see our life as a community more clearly, so that we can clarify our goals and clearly identify what we need in a new rector. The self-study process is designed to invite the whole parish into the process.

Once the parish profile has been completed and submitted to the diocese, the Search Committee will work with the diocesan Office of Transition Ministry to identify potential candidates. The profile will also be made public, so that clergy throughout the Episcopal Church can read and share it.

Once appropriate candidates have been identified, they will be interviewed by the Search Committee. This process will include phone and in-person interviews, as well as (if practical) visiting candidates in their current parish or other place of ministry to hear them preach and see them in that context. The Search Committee will use the information gathered about various candidates to make a recommendation to the vestry for approval.

This process, in its entirety, can take anywhere from six months to a year. It is purposefully designed to help us slow down and look as clearly as we can at ourselves as a community and determine our needs, so that we can make a careful decision that will best serve St. George's for many years to come. Our Interim Rector will provide the stability and the day-to-day oversight we need to take the time to fully engage the process. It can feel overwhelming, but it is also an exciting place to be, and I am looking forward to participating in this process as your Senior Warden.


Wednesday Weavings

SAFE Alliance Comfort Bags

Three or four times a year, St. George's creates and gives hand-crafted bags filled with both necessities and luxuries to the SAFE Alliance (Stop Abuse for Everyone – formerly SafePlace), to be given to women and men who are undergoing clinical exams for and official reports of sexual assault. We usually gather as a community to make and fill the bags, but we are obviously not able to do so now. But as we know, the pandemic has not reduced the need, and SAFE has let us know that they could use more bags. Fortunately, we had a number of bags already stockpiled, and numerous members of the Outreach Committee have been able to pitch in and make an emergency delivery happen. Many thanks to Gayle Wall, who has sewn 50 bags (!) on her own; to

Herb and Sandra Dickson, who have collected 75 note cards from various parishioners (and to the parishioners who wrote them); to Frances Rickard, who has coordinated collection of all the needed items for the bags (and to everyone who contributed items); and to Alice Nelson and Sarah Campbell, who (wearing masks and using copious amounts of hand sanitizer) met to stuff the bags.

On **Sunday, August 16**th, during our Zoom "coffee hour" after the service, Father Kevin will bless the bags in preparation for their delivery to SAFE. Although we weren't able to gather for our traditional community sew-in, this ministry still comes from the heart of our community, and your support of it has been and continues to be important!

New School Year Blessing

The beginning of the school year brings with it even more anxieties than usual this year. Whether and when students, teachers, and staff will be going back to school in person is still an open question, but one way or another, school will start. All those involved in making school happen need our prayers more than ever – not only that school will be an enriching

News from the School

The school is completing the last two weeks of summer camp this month. The summer program has operated smoothly and has served as a model for us to continue serving our families this fall. We will begin our school year on Monday, August 24th, with 78 children. For the past few years, we have had 110 children. This virus is still making an impact on the school, but we will get through this.

The families tell us they will be back as soon as they feel it is safe, many of them pointing to the first of next year. The school will do their best to welcome them back as quickly as we can. The school has just enough staff to operate under current conditions and would need to hire more teachers with the addition of more students.

During the month of August, the school has an onboarding process for the families enrolled. We will continue this process via Zoom gatherings. In lieu of Blessing of the Backpacks the teachers will use Zoom for the children and parents to greet each other and begin making new connections or reconnect with families they have not seen over the summer months.

And finally, the school families and school board members have been notified of Father Kevin's new assignment to St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Wimberley. While this is sad news for us, I am thrilled for him and his beautiful family. Father Kevin has been wonderful to collaborate with and an inspiration to me. His gentle way of guiding me personally, and improving the school, is something I will cherish. Peace be with you, Father Kevin!
