





Letter from the Rector

"Reweaving the Fabric" (Stewarding our Relationships)

Truly, I think that, for as long as I live, I will never forget what happened yesterday, Sunday, July 30, in Kleberg Hall at St. George's Church.

After the "maiden voyage" of a new (interim) music minister and a beautiful and robustly attended service of Word and Sacrament, it was finally time to gather for our "Fifth Sunday Brunch," spearheaded by the vestry and other key leaders in our church community. New St. George's T-shirts were out for folks to pick up (and to record their T-shirt size for next year!).

Speaking of things laid out on tables, the quantity of food (let alone the quality) was truly shocking! (Based on one report I heard, folks may have forgotten about dessert not just because they were stuffed from the main meal but also because the dessert table had to be set up at a completely different station due to the large amount of dishes, both main and dessert!)

And now, after folks got their food and settled down at their tables, came the time to begin our discussion/presentation of "Reweaving the Fabric" (inspired not just by SAFE bags and Guatemalan textiles but also by the importance in our community of "Wednesday Weavings," a regular gathering of folks in people's homes during the week). Perhaps the Rector's remarks were a bit underwhelming! After all, these saints have "been around the block" a few times and have "seen it all,".... And so I'm confident in saying that the "real action" of the event was not the discussion of the stewardship 2023 theme, not the dates for the upcoming stewardship campaign, not the rector's closing prayer ... but rather the stories.

But wait. Before I get to the stories, I should say that, of the fifty folks in the Hall, the vast majority filled out a "congregational gifts" worksheet and submitted it! What a great way to sift through, pray over, and organize people's gifts, interests, and visions/desires for ministry and our life and mission together!

Letter from the Rector

Thanks be to God that I have not one, not two, but three wise leaders on our stewardship team this year, folks who will thrive at the task of stewardship that information with me. (After all, stewardship is about more than money; it is a year-round endeavor.)

OK, back to stories. After Sandra's thorough, vivid, and heartfelt rendition of the life and gifts of Ralph Hauser, it was time for the rank and file to speak. What encourages me so much is the source of these stories. These speakers, who stood up one after another and spoke about ways in which St. George's has blessed them, were prompted by the calls we made, following up on last year's pledge cards. Not the financial pledges but the pledges of time, talent, and prayer. Each leader—Jan Phillips and Hal Stevens (our stewardship team from last year) and Melissa Brackin, Tracy Cornelius, and Margaret Tipps (this year's leadership team)—had made calls (together with myself), following up and touching base with folks about these commitments made in the previous year. Out of this effort, this relational shepherding ministry, emerged the stories shared by the saints of St. George's, one after another, of God's faithfulness and love, in and through this church.

And so, by the grace of God (and the wisdom of gifted servant-leaders, including the Rev. Beth Fain, a canon with the Diocese who is leading a "Cohort" of parishes through "best practices" for stewardship), we are off to a good start in our 2024 stewardship campaign at St. George's. Ground zero, the first step, is not about money; it's about relationships.

Please join me in praying that "Reweaving the Fabric" would result in stronger foundations, new vigor, and fresh vision for this wonderful parish as we go forward together in mission, in justice, and in love.

Altar Flowers and Candles

Besides enhancing our worship, the Sunday altar flowers offer St. George's parishioners an opportunity to donate funds for the flowers, often in memory of a loved one or in thanksgiving for a blessing in your life. Each week's reading stands on its own, so you don't miss anything but the good company and conversation if you can't come one week. Below is a statement of St. George's actual income and expenses for the first half (January – June) of 2023, compared to the income and expenses budgeted by the Vestry. This statement does not include income or expenses from funds outside the general operating fund, such as Outreach Committee projects, the Rector's Discretionary Fund, and the Memorial Fund.

The recent painting of the church was funded through the royalties received in the Gas Lease Fund. We will soon receive new chairs for Kleberg Hall (yay!), which were graciously funded through the gift of Ralph Hausser's annuity naming St. George's as the beneficiary. Gifts to the Capital Improvements Fund, Memorial Fund, Rector's Discretionary Fund, and Outreach Committee Fund are always welcome (in addition to your regular pledges, of course!).
