# The Feast of the Epiphany


With the Feast of the Epiphany, on Sunday, January 6<sup>th</sup>, the 12-day season of Christmas draws to a close, and the church moves into the season of Epiphany. The Word *epiphany* comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, which means "appearing" or "revealing." The season of Epiphany focuses on God's self-revelation in Christ. Christian tradition pays special attention to the gradual revelation of Christ's nature as shown in three events: the visit of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and the Wedding at Cana where he performed his first miracle, changing water into wine. With each of these events, the circle of those who see and recognize Jesus for who he is – God with us – grows larger. And with this revelation, the promise of Christmas

begins to be fulfilled, as the light of Christ enters the world: "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you" (Isaiah 60:1). God is always making God's-self known to us.



# 2019 Vestry Slate

The Vestry is the governing body of an Episcopal Parish, responsible for managing the resources and finances of the church, making legal decisions, and ensuring effective organization and planning for all church activities. The St. George's vestry consists of up nine members, elected to serve staggered three-year terms. At the Annual Parish Meeting each January, three new members are elected for three-year terms, and if necessary, members are also elected for one or two years, in order to complete the terms

of members who were unable to do so.

The current vestry presents the following 2019 slate for election to at the Annual Parish Meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup>: Rob Blech, Ed Crawford, Samantha Stevens (three-year terms), and Raul Carrera (one-year term).

#### **Rob Blech**

**Time at St. George's** | We have attended St. George's for about 15 years.

**Prior Vestry experience** | I have served on the St. George's Vestry and was serving as Senior Warden when Kevin was called.

**Involvement at St. George's** | In addition to serving on Vestry and as Senior Warden, I have also served as the President of the St. George's Court board, as a Lector, and as a LEM.

**Gifts and abilities to bring to the work of the Vestry** | I bring my legal background, trust in my fellow parishioners, and healthy humility.



# Bishop Suffragan Election

The Diocese of Texas will elect a Bishop Suffragan to assist the diocesan bishop, the Rt. Rev. C. Andrew Doyle, on Friday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>, at its 170<sup>th</sup> Diocesan Council.

All bishops are called to follow in the footsteps of the apostles, teaching, uniting, and reconciling in the name of Christ. Bishops Suffragan are elected to support and without

automatic succession to the diocesan bishop. They are assigned a particular portfolio. The strategic role a Bishop Suffragan plays within the life of a diocese is far more than preaching and confirming on Sunday mornings. The job description for the new Bishop Suffragan in the Diocese of Texas will include serving as board chair of several diocesan institutions, visitations of 67 churches in the western region of the Diocese, a strategic partnership with the executive team of the Diocese, and other jobs as befit the unique gifts she will bring as an individual leader. Elected delegates from each of the Diocese's congregations and diocesan clergy will elect the next bishop suffragan to succeed retiring Bishop Suffragan Dena Harrison.



The Rev. Hannah E. Atkins Romero

The Rev. Hannah E. Atkins Romero, the Rev. Canon Glenice Robinson-Como, and the Rev. Canon Kathryn (Kai) Ryan have been approved to stand for election as Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of Texas, the diocesan Standing Committee announced November 26. Atkins Romero is Rector of Trinity, Houston; Robinson-Como is Missioner for Outreach and Justice Ministries at Christ Church Cathedral, Houston; and Ryan serves at Canon to the Ordinary and Chief Operating Officer on the diocesan staff. Profiles of each candidate in English and Spanish are available on the website at <a href="www.epicenter.org">www.epicenter.org</a>. "Each person brings unique gifts and disposition, and each has secular and church experience that makes them qualified to do the work of this particular office," said the Rev. Chuck Treadwell, chair of the search committee.

Delegates will get to meet the candidates at a "walkabout" at Camp Allen on January 5, 2019, in order to get to know those who have put their names forward. Each candidate will give a brief presentation, followed by a Q&A session. Participants will move between rooms of each candidate, hence the term "walkabout." Each candidate's presentation is designed to provide delegates a context within which to consider the selection of the candidate as a spiritual leader in this Diocese. While we are electing a Bishop Suffragan for the Diocese of Texas, the person elected will also be a bishop for the whole Church.



Please continue to pray for the candidates, and for those who will elect a new bishop suffragan.


