Rector's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

I pray that you and your family are doing well, staying safe, and making the best of our current conditions due to the pandemic. I know that each one of us is affected by the pandemic, and our beloved St. George's is not immune to these effects either. I am absolutely blown away by the response the church has received during this time. Our virtual services are being utilized by many; folks are maintaining their pledges; and the general mindset is positive and progressive.

Along with the vestry, the St. George's Task Force for Re-gathering has been working hard to set a course for St. George's, especially as it pertains to opening in-person services again. I believe that everyone shares the desire to be together in person, and at the same time we desire to reduce the risk of exposure to the virus, both for individuals and our wider community. The leadership of St. George's continues to be worried about the recent surge of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations in the Austin area, and we recognize that church gatherings are high-risk contexts for spreading the virus. Although the Task Force is working with the diocese on our plan to open for in-person worship services, we agree to abide by the current guidelines and regulations put in place by our state, county, and city. We will not begin in-person worship services until these restrictions have been lifted and we feel comfortable in doing so. This means that we will continue to meet virtually at least until August 15th.

This is a trying time for us all. Personally, I miss each and every one of you. We have surely witnessed tremendous changes to our common life together, and we have had to set aside much of our normalcy, desires, and hopes during this time. Thankfully, we have a great amount of sacrificial theology to guide us. I am reminded of these words from the Gospel of Luke 9:23-25, "Jesus said, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it. What does it profit them if they gain the whole world, but lose or forfeit themselves." I believe that at this time our calling to take up our cross and follow Jesus means working toward the health and safety of our communities. This requires much sacrifice on our part – wearing our masks, refraining from gathering in large groups, sheltering in place, setting aside our desire to be together for the well-being of the whole. By sacrificing in these ways, we are losing a great deal in the near term, but in the long run we are literally saving lives. So, let us take up our crosses together and allow God to transform the world by doing our part for the well-being of the Kingdom of God.

Dear St. George's Family:

It's hard for me to believe that it's been almost four months since we've worshipped together in the same space. The "new normal" of COVID-19 seems almost surreal to me. I know you all are out there, but I see only a handful of you in person each Sunday. I miss you a lot and greatly look forward to Phase 2, when we can worship in the same space.

Even with social distancing and masks, I will consider it a very happy occasion.

During the pandemic, I am only at St. George's on Sunday, but, after the service, I visit with our neighbors under the highway and help them with \$10 HEB gift cards and clothes, which I bring to them. Sometimes I have food to distribute, some of which is outdated food from Whole Foods and some of which is leftover food from University Baptist Church's Thursday meal. There is also a parishioner at All Saints' who sometimes gives me thirty or so peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, which I also give out.

The City of Austin appears to be more tolerant of the homeless during the pandemic, not trying to drive them out from underneath the highway and even leaving portable toilets and a wash station for their use. I even hear from one of our homeless neighbors that the City will clean up around the homeless campsites without trying to evict them.

The house long abandoned on the corner of the Northbound I-35 Service Road and Ardenwood Road is now occupied and the area outside the house has now been cleaned up, which is certainly good news to the neighborhood residents. So, some good things are happening. I hope we continue our ministry to the homeless in the months to come, and I thank you profusely for the support I have received from donations to the deacon's discretionary fund, which has allowed me to help those most in need. You have made St. George's a friend to the homeless and they are appreciative.


Summer Schedule

Online Flower Donation Calendar

St. George's Flower Donation Calendar has moved online! About half the Sundays between now and Advent don't yet have anyone signed up to donate flowers, and you are invited to sign up. You can give flowers in honor of someone, in celebration of an important event, in thanksgiving for a blessing in your life, or in memory of loved one. To donate flowers, please visit the online Flower Donation Calendar and enter your name and, if you wish, your dedication, next to the week of your



choice. (To be sure that your donation is listed in the bulletin, please sign up at least two weeks in advance.) **A donation of \$35** is requested. You can make your donation by check or electronically through our online giving program. Make checks made payable to St. George's, with a note on the memo line indicating that the check is for altar flowers, and mail it to the church office. To give electronically, visit the **St. George's Donation page**, scroll down to "Designated Gifts" / "Altar Guild," and enter the amount of your donation.

Flower Guild Begins at St. George's



Perhaps you noticed the beautiful flower arrangements in the sanctuary next to the altar during our online worship services last month. The arrangements were the beginnings of a new lay ministry at St. George's to be known as the Flower Guild. Here's how it came about and how it works.

Almost simultaneously with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic and stay-at-home services, our long-time parish florist, Jack Brown, decided to retire. For as many as 50 years, as best we can recall, Jack provided the flowers for Sunday services and special occasions at St. George's, and we are so grateful for his years of service. With Jack's retirement, we have not had flowers at the altar on Sunday mornings, until several parishioners who had previously expressed interest in arranging flowers met (on Zoom, of course!) to see if preparing flower arrangements would be something St. George's could do in-house. After a few weeks of a pilot program

in June and an enthusiastic response from Fr. Kevin, they agreed to continue and to become the first members of the Flower Guild.

Members procure the flowers from the source of their choice, including their own gardens, arrange them in clear glass vases, and bring them to the church on Saturday or on Sunday morning. Members are reimbursed for their expenses through the church budget and donations made by parishioners for the weekly altar flowers (see article on page 4). Although the Flower Guild is not part of the Altar Guild, an Altar Guild representative was most helpful in providing information as the Flower Guild got off the ground, and the two ministries will remain in close communication.

Right now, we have three parishioners on the Flower Guild and are looking for others who would like to serve! If working with flowers and preparing them for the Sunday altar might bring you joy or be of interest to you, please consider being a part of this ministry. Professional experience or expertise is NOT required! Current members of the Flower Guild will be more than happy to provide tips, assistance, and encouragement to those who would like to give it a try. News from the School

Greetings from the School! We have been open now for a month and so far we are doing well with managing the spread of COVID. We have a plan in place if it happens, but our plan also includes proactive measures to reduce transmission. Our enrollment however is still very low, so with a heavy heart, I had to begin lay-offs. I am grateful to have a school board who sympathizes with this delicate situation. Our enrollment has dropped from 110 children to 40. Our staff has dropped from 28 to 16. I pray

we do not have to make any more cuts this summer.

The changes made to the PPP guidelines has given us more flexibility, but the reality of our finances is concerning. I do not know what the future holds. Parents are changing their minds almost daily about whether to come back. I will not know how many plan on returning for our school year until probably early August.

Please pray for us, along with those teachers who gave so much. They left with understanding, but also with a longing for our sweet little school. And know that our thoughts and prayers are also with each of you.
