Rector's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

After church on May 31st, Pentecost Sunday, many of us gathered for our traditional Fifth Sunday Potluck via Zoom. I greatly appreciate all of you who logged in to hear updates regarding St. George's during this time of pandemic and our plans for regathering. For those of you who weren't able to attend, I've included some highlights below.

First and foremost, I want to thank all who have played a part in the upkeep

of St. George's over the past several weeks while we've have moved to virtual gatherings. A special thanks to our vestry, school board, staff, clergy, choir, lectors, and treasurer. Without your dedication and commitment, St. George's would not be in the healthy place in which we find ourselves. I also want to thank all of you who have been able to contribute financially. We are currently healthy and stable, and I am very grateful for your contributions.

I also want to thank our newly formed Regathering Task Force. These ten individuals have provided their expertise and courage to devise a plan for re-entry to in-person worship. This plan has been developed and is now at our regional Bishop's office for recommendations and approval. Once we receive this approval the church office will share the plan with the entire congregation. But simply put, the plan states that once it is safe to return to in-person worship, St. George's will begin with one worship service held at outside on Sunday mornings. All participants will be required to follow very particular safety precautions, including face masks, contact tracing procedures, and social distancing. Folks in the vulnerable population (over the age of 65 and/or health issues) are strongly encouraged to continue to meet virtually for the worship service. We will be offering virtual live worship in perpetuity. And, for that matter, if you prefer to stay home for any reason, you are encouraged to continue to worship with us online. There is no pressure for anyone to return to in-person services until you feel comfortable doing so.

I greatly appreciate all of you who were able to complete our online survey. The results will continue to be helpful for the Task Force to devise and implement our plan. It is clear from the results that our parishioners are very mindful of the health and safety of our community. More communication regarding these results will also come from the Task Force soon.

May all of you have a blessed month this June. I pray that you are safe and well and that you continue to join us virtually on Sunday mornings. If there is anything you may need during this time, please don't hesitate to reach out to me.

Online Services



Wednesday Weavings



COVID-19 Testing



Austin Public Health has launched an online Enrollment Form for COVID-19 testing, available at AustinTexas.gov/COVID19. The online form will allow people to take an assessment to determine eligibility and schedule testing without a referral from a healthcare provider. To access the form, click

PREVENT. PROMOTE. PROTECT. If on a healthcare provider. To access the form, click on the "Take Self-Assessment" button to create an account and complete a questionnaire listing your symptoms. If you meet the criteria you will be referred to testing. Completion of the online assessment does not guarantee referral to testing. Austin Public Health will continue to prioritize healthcare workers, first responders, and people at higher risk for developing severe symptoms. Testing continues to be by appointment-only and tests at the APH testing sites are FREE.

Volunteers Needed

News from the School



We are happy to announce that St. George's Episcopal School is reopening on Monday, June 1st. The School Board and Church Vestry have been instrumental in our decision making process, and I can't thank them enough for their wise guidance during this time. Throughout this process, I have remained in close contact with the governmental agencies responsible for creating the guidelines for us to safely reopen. I offered two Zoom meetings for our families to vocalize their concerns and ask questions about the school's 5 Point Plan for Resuming Operations under COVID-19. These meetings were nicely attended and great

questions were asked. I have an **FAQ page** on our website, if anyone is interested in reading more about the state of our school. I would like to share my opening statement at the parent Zoom meeting as it sums up my feelings about our decision.

Before we begin today, I would like to take a minute to talk about why we are opening. Here at St. George's, we understand that child care is ESSENTIAL and that not every family has a support system beyond us. We already provide families with a sense of peace that they can leave their most precious gift here with us, so that they can earn a living. And we now need to earn your trust and provide assurance during these times that your child will be safe.

Living in Austin is expensive and typically requires a two-income family. I am passionate about providing families with the next-best care they can have, other than being at home with you. We feel as though we are part of their family too, and we take that seriously. We are accustomed to working in an environment that is centered around infection control already, so we have the training and expertise on how to conduct ourselves. We will now have additional training in techniques that will reduce the spread of COVID-19. COVID is here, and we have to learn to live with it. You are blessed to have a school filled with teachers who take it seriously and will do everything humanly possible to keep your child safe. I know it will take time for you to feel secure, and you have my promise that we are ready and willing to do what's necessary to be here for you and your child.
