



## Letter from the Rector THE REV. DR. MATT BOULTER

# The Point of Lent: Honesty With Self

What is the purpose of Lent? I'd say it's this: learning to tell the truth ... to yourself.

I recently conversed with a friend who was curious about the Roman Catholic practice of auricular confession (confessing one's sins to a priest). He was somewhat astounded when I showed him the Rite of Reconciliation in the Prayer Book (as he had assumed that Anglicans/Episcopalians don't share the practice with Catholics).

In our discussion I said, "I think it is important to have at least one person in your life to whom you tell absolutely everything. Otherwise, it is almost certainly the case that you are lying to yourself."

At least one person. Maybe that person is your therapist. Maybe it's your friend, or your spiritual director, or your spouse. Maybe it is some kind of sponsor, like those in twelve-step programs.

It's relatively unimportant who that person is, in my opinion. What's more important is that you are "doing the work," that you are telling at least one person in your life absolutely everything. No secrets, no shadows, no deception or evasion.

That is the point, I told my friend, of confessing to a priest. It's not exactly a matter of psychological therapeutic-ness (to coin a noun). It's really just a matter of learning to be honest. (Such honesty is more difficult for some than for others.)

Something similar, it seems to me, is true for Lent. When we admit our weakness, we are becoming more honest. We are telling the truth about ourselves at a deeper level. It is not about "groveling" before some spiritual authority (or before God) or "beating yourself up." It's simply about learning to tell the truth about who you are, and what's going on inside of you. Doing that in ways that are appropriate and guided by love. Love of God, love of others, love of one's own self.

In my opinion, the world needs more of this. More opportunities to tell the truth about oneself without shame or fear, in an environment that is truly "safe." (The church is a safe place with a very dangerous message—the ferocious love of God.)

In Lent there is an emphasis on sin, on admitting the sin in our lives. Such admission, when done in the right spirit, is the pathway, a pathway, to freedom, to joy, to love.




#### 2024 Lenten Program

## ST. GEORGE'S EPISCOPAL SCHOOL

#### TEACHERS CONTINUING EDUCATION

President's Day was an in-service training for the teachers presented by Carla and Mari and focused on the Language Arts Curriculum. Each Educational Director took their age groups and reviewed how and why a classroom enriched with literacy activities positively impacts children's future development.

Carla started her teaching teams (infants-toddlers) with a make-and-take literacy activity. Then each team presented their activity to the group and explained how they would scaffold the activity for individual children. It made for lively conversation and exploration. Mari took her group and extended their knowledge of story baskets and dramatization, a couple of techniques she learned during her training from Rice University's Classroom Storytelling Project experience, and shared it with the Yellow, Pink, Blue, and Rainbow teachers.

I then had the teachers explore new curriculum books and set up three activities in their classrooms. Each teacher visited each classroom and had to identify the objective of the activity and whether or not it was age-appropriate. We ended the day with a communication game called Fact Connect. During this game, one person begins by stating what led them into early childhood education. The person to their right listens for a common fact to extend upon until everyone has had a turn connecting with a fact. We learned a lot about one another during that game. And improved our active listening skills, too.
