truly lovely serendipity. It is a pleasure and a privilege to follow Kevin Schubert at St. George's, if only for three months.






Women's Book Group



Stewardship

On **October 11**th, we will begin our annual season of stewardship at St. George's, culminating on Generosity Sunday, November 15th. This year's theme, **Faith-Filled Generosity**, is a call to each one of us to be generous and ready to share so that our futures are secure and our lives are worth living. Eugene Peterson writes it this way in *The Message*:

"Tell them to go after God, who piles on all the riches we could ever manage – to do good, to be rich in helping others, to be extravagantly generous. If they do that, they'll build a treasury that will last, gaining life that is truly life." (1 Timothy 6:18b-19)

During this season, we prayerfully consider our financial commitment to St. George's in the year ahead. Many of the scripture readings and sermons in the upcoming weeks will reflect this theme, particularly focusing on stewardship as a spiritual practice and an act of faithful generosity. We will also hear from some parishioners about their personal approaches to giving. An insert in the bulletin each week will address a different way that we as individuals and as a community can live more fully with a spirit of generosity.
