Senior Warden's Corner

Dear St. George's Family:

As Kevin has moved to a new parish with our blessing and best wishes, we find ourselves in transition. The Canon to the Ordinary and the Transition Minister for the Diocese of Texas attended our August vestry meeting and explained to us the general process for getting an interim rector and finding a new rector (and they provided us with a much-appreciated checklist!). The diocese has just connected us



with potential interim rectors and I hope to meet with them this week, along with other members of the vestry's executive committee (our junior warden, Ed Crawford, and our clerk, Brad Dieringer) so that we have an interim in place by the end of the month.

Our first step in finding a new rector will be the vestry's creation of a search committee that will conduct a self-study and create a parish profile, likely with the help of a vendor recommended by the diocese. The purpose of these activities is to help us clarify our goals and identify our specific needs for a rector. All members of the parish will be invited to participate in this process. Once the parish profile has been submitted, the diocese will work with our search committee to provide the profile to clergy throughout the Episcopal Church and to identify potential candidates. The search committee will interview candidates and make a recommendation to the vestry. This full process can take up to a year, because it is important that we make a thorough search and thoughtful decision in choosing a rector.

Our Regathering Task Force is also working hard to improve our virtual Sunday services and prepare for in-person services. The Task Force will continue to monitor COVID-19 data, and we look forward to having in-person services again when it is safe. We will continue our online services even after that time, since we know that not everyone will be comfortable coming in-person, so we are investing in new audio-visual equipment that will greatly improve our sound and video quality. We hope to have our new system in place by Sunday, September 13th! Please join me in thanking our new Media Manager, Brad Dieringer, for his hard work on this. (And no, he did not get a raise with that promotion.)

The members of the vestry and Regathering Task Force have been looking for more ways for all of us to connect as a community during this challenging time. Some of the regular parish activities are taking place virtually – Wednesday Weavings, Women's Book Group, Choir, and Outreach Committee meetings are wonderful opportunities to spend some time with fellow parishioners. Meeting virtually allows more of us to participate, and newcomers to these groups are always welcome! And if you want to start a new group, please let me know and we can make the St. George's Zoom account available.

The vestry will also be hosting several virtual get-togethers in September, in order to share information about our activities and plans and get feedback from the congregation. (See the article on page 5 for more information.) We hope everyone will be able to participate!

Dear St. George's Family:

It's hard to believe Kevin is gone. I received a call today about a couch stuffed in our dumpster, and I realized that Kevin is no longer here to take care of such things. I miss him!

I've been pretty busy this past month doing outreach work with the homeless. Besides working at the Micah 6 Drop-In Center for street kids and at and Trinity Center, handing out breakfasts to street folks, I've been passing out bus passes at the state campground near the airport and at several other locations. In addition, my beautiful bride Cynthia has cooked dinner for the Micah 6 street kids, which I helped make and serve.

I continue to find joy in ministering to the homeless. Whether it's across the street from St. George's or out at the state campground, I am exhilarated by the ministry I do. I take St. George's with me wherever I go. Today I attended a Zoom meeting as a board member of the Religious Coalition to Assist the Homeless, and every time a new grant seeker joined the meeting, I was introduced as being from St. George's. We have a long history of commitment to social justice, and I am honored to play a role in maintaining that tradition.

In this time of COVID, it's hard to know what will happen next. But whatever that may be, I know that there will always be needy folks whom we can serve and there will always be St. George's people to serve them. Whenever I am out doing ministry with the homeless, I am reminded of what Jesus said in Matthew 25: "Whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me." How true.

New School Year Blessing


The beginning of the school year brings with it even more anxieties than usual this year. Whether and when students, teachers, and staff will be going back to school in person is still an open question, but one way or another, school will start. All those involved in making school happen need our prayers more than ever – not only that school will be an enriching experience for everyone involved, but also that they will be able to work together to protect everyone's safety, especially those who are most vulnerable. We won't be able to

have our children bring forward their backpacks for a blessing as in previous years, but our liturgy on **Sunday, September 6th** will include a blessing for a healthy, educational, enjoyable, and safe new school year. (This blessing was originally scheduled for August 23rd, before AISD postponed the start of the school year until September 8th.)

Outreach Updates

The Outreach Committee had a very productive online meeting on August 11th. Here are somehighlights:

• Virtual Fundraiser:

Outreach will hold a virtual fundraiser during the month of September. The money will be used to fund projects like shopping for Any Baby Can food bags, supporting the St. George's Court account at Central Texas Food Bank, and other potential projects such as work with the homeless community or COVID-19 relief. Please consider making a donation to support



our church's outreach program. Because the office is closed much of the time, a paper check can be a slow way to donate. If possible, please donate online at <u>St. George's</u> <u>Online Donation page</u>, indicating the amount of your donation next to "Undesignated Outreach." (You may also mail a check made out to St. George's with "Outreach" in the memo line to the church office, but it may be up to a month before your check is deposited.) You are always so generous – even in these uncertain times, we know we can count on your support.

• Any Baby Can Food Bags:

Since 1980, our church has been supporting emergency food relief through Any Baby Can and the predecessor nonprofit CEDEN. We provide bags of approved, nutritionally balanced food that does not require a lot of preparation. This service has been on hold during the pandemic since case workers were not making in-person visits. ABC is hoping to resume home visits by the end of October. When that time comes, we will need shoppers who can volunteer once a month or once every other month to take a prescribed list, buy the groceries, sort them into 10 bags, and deliver the bags to the ABC headquarters. Funds for the food have been allocated, and shoppers submit receipts to the church treasurer for reimbursement.

• Christopher House Baskets:

On March 8th, we held a very successful basket sale – talk about the last minute! The world changed very shortly afterwards, and one change is that because of the social distancing being enforced, Christopher House only wants one basket delivered per week rather than two. Since many parishioners purchased two baskets, planning to deliver them both at the same time, that leaves many of you with an undelivered basket! In order to sign up to deliver a basket – whether or not you already have one – please visit the **Online Christopher House Basket Calendar**, which runs from September 2020 through February 2021. Type your name next to the available week of your choice, and indicate whether or not you already have a basket. If you do not have a basket, contact Alice Nelson at **mzlsnlsn@gmail.com** to make arrangements to get one. Because of uncertain numbers of patients, Christopher House has requested that no perishable items be included in the basket.

• Holiday Outreach:

Carolyn Moreau has agreed to be the St. George's liaison for the Hands for Hope Thanksgiving distribution coordinated by El Buen Samaritano. We have no information at this point about the shape of the program because of the pandemic, but Carolyn will keep us informed as the time draws closer. For Christmas, we will once again have an Angel Wreath with a stocking containing a gift card from HEB for each resident of St. George's Court. We will also provide money for phone cards to Casa Marianella to help its resident stay in touch with family and friends over the holidays. Martha Paull has contributed the handmade stockings, and Jennifer Bigbee has agreed to coordinate construction of the wreath. The exact details of how the stockings will get decorated and how distribution will be handled are not yet clear. We will provide further information as the time is closer.

• SAFE Comfort Bag Delivery:

Thanks to efforts by many parishioners, we were able to deliver 75 beautiful comfort bags to SAFE, even though we couldn't get together for a sew-in or bag assembly. Holly Bowles, our SAFE contact, joined us for online services and the blessing of the bags on August 16th, and she spoke a few moving words about the impact that this gift has on recipients when they are at their most vulnerable. Gayle Wall and Patsy Chandler made all the bags, and in addition, Gayle provided a handmade mask for each bag. Herb and Sandra Dickson made sure that we had a handwritten note for each bag, and Frances Rickard coordinated the contribution and delivery of the many items that go into each bag. The donation response by our members was truly inspiring. Holly and our friends at SAFE will let us know when more bags are needed. For now we say thank you so much for your gifts.

Many thanks to all of you who have done so much to support St. George's Outreach projects over the years. It can be difficult to find ways to continue our important work during this pandemic, but it is more needed than ever.
